Last year's report ended with words of hope and events in this last year have given substance to them. It would not be inaccurate to say that LCC is on the verge of a new phase in its life. As the Director's report states, the refurbishment of the accommodation block is progressing and there are plans to further the work of refurbishment in the main building. All this is a result of the vision and commitment of the trustees and its new Director. Tina Healy was appointed in November, and from that time has achieved much more than we could have hoped for in such a short time.

At the time writing, though not strictly in 2010, it should be mentioned that we were very sad to see the resignation of Tony Cant as both trustee and treasurer Tony throughout 2010 was pivotal in the work and planning the future of the Centre. We thank them for their commitment and work over the years. The board is strengthened by the appointments of Stephen Treasure and James Wheeler, the latter also as treasurer.

As the Director has said, at LCC we continue to be supported and served by an equally committed team of people They are the 'face' of the Centre to our users and in the good tradition of LCC/BMC present us in the best way We thank them for their dedication and work

By the time I write the next report we will have had in residence for a short time our new friends from Keele University and the building work at that end of the Centre will be over, allowing us to develop the use of the Centre in exciting new ways

I thank my fellow trustees for their varied and valuable contributions to LCC, without which life would be difficult for the work of the Centre

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing documents

The Bishop Mascall Centre Foundation is a company limited by guarantee (and also a charity) which is governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association Registered on 4th January 2001 these show the objects of the BMCF as "to advance the education of the public and promote the principles of the Church of England"

The original endowment is now governed by a charitable scheme relating to the property of which the Bishop Mascall Centre Foundation is the sole trustee

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The rules pertaining to the roles of the Trustees are set out in the Memorandum and Articles of Association Representatives are nominated by the Diocese of Hereford, Ludlow Town Council and Shropshire County Council The Rector of Ludlow is a Trustee ex-officio Four further "independent" Trustees are elected for a four year term

Induction and training of new trustees

The Trustee job description is based on a template from the National Council of Voluntary Organisations (NCVO)

Organisational structure

The Trustees are responsible for areas such as governance, audit and long term direction as well as the appointment of the Centre Director. The Executive Committee assists the resident management team in the day to day affairs of the Centre, and co-ordinates the work of the three management sub-committees whose remits are Finance, Fabric and Staffing.

Risk Assessment

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

Two potential risk areas can be identified

- 1 The Centre's buildings and equipment are again in need of repair and renewal,
- 2 This impacts on Health and Safety issues which are dealt with in the Centre's Health and Safety policy

Charitable Scheme for the Endowment

The Charity is organised through meetings of the Trustees (Directors), of which seven took place in 2010 The day to day running of the activities of the Charity is carried out by the residential management team

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Memorandum and Articles of Association, registered on 4th January 2001, show the aims of the Bishop Mascall Centre Foundation (BMCF) as "to advance the education of the public and promote the principles of the Church of England"

The BMCF is therefore an educational charity with a broad remit, which exists for the benefit of the community of Ludlow and surrounding districts. The charity runs the Ludlow Conference Centre ("the LCC") and is also a company limited by guarantee.

Mission Statement

The LCC is a unique place in rural South Shropshire where all are welcome, we provide services for people of all ages to learn, and create opportunities for community life to flourish. The LCC aims to be affordable and accessible to all

The policies adopted in order to further those objects have been to maximise the use of the Centre providing accommodation for church and community events of an educational nature. It is policy to balance use by organisations furthering the education of those under twenty five and those promoting education among adults in a broad area. From time to time, in order to maximise the income available to further the objects of the Charity, non-educational events organised by outside organisations take place at the Centre. In addition, the Centre itself has promoted events of an educational nature.

Priorities for 2011

The Centre encourages a very broad range of education and learning

- Learning for All The Centre will continue to promote, support and encourage groups and individuals to use the facilities for training and educational proposes. In 2011 a priority will be the promotion of the Centre to encourage as broader range of users as possible. This will be achieved through a range of methods including a market research survey, open day, newsletters, targeted publicity, updating the website etc.
- Young People Use of the Centre by schools, colleges, youth groups and universities will be limited in 2011 due to the closure and refurbishment of the accommodation wing. However we will continue to encourage and support organisations that work with young people to use the facilities. We will work closely with organisations such as Homestart and Busy Bodies Nursery.
- Spiritual Development The Centre will continue to encourage and support diverse activities which enable people to explore and build their understanding of spirituality in different ways, and which build bridges between people of different beliefs and backgrounds. We will nurture our relationship with the Hereford Diocese and continue to support the work of WEMTC and other church groups.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Centre Directors Report 2010

Looking back at the Centre Director's report for 2009 it starts with the sentence 'Again 2009 has been a year of change' The same sentence is very apt for 2010. The then Director, Moira Gibbs, left in February leaving the remaining senior staff to 'man the helm', a challenge to which they rose magnificently and for which the Trustees are very grateful

In June Sandie Johnson temporarily stood down as a Trustee and took on the role of Director, on a part-time basis, until the new Director took up her post in November A new catering manager was appointed in July

The Centre continues to meet its objectives as an educational charity providing rooms for conferences, meetings and training. It continues to be a base for WEMTC and the Hereford Diocese Resource centre and library. Day lettings have remained consistent with 2009 whilst residential lettings have been reduced.

Talks with Keele University Medical School have progressed throughout the year with a final agreement that the project would go ahead reached in November. It was agreed that the Centre would provide accommodation for 11 students for 48 weeks per year for a minimum of 7 years. The accommodation wing would need to be extended and refurbished and KUMS would contribute a £100,000 towards this. An additional £150,000 has also been secured for this purpose from a grant making trust.

The Centre continues to provide accommodation for Busy Bodies Nursery, South Shropshire Furniture Scheme, a Chiropractor, Traidcraft, and as of December, Homestart as well as a private tenancy at the Director's House

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Principal funding sources

The Centre is both a charity and a social enterprise as it has to earn all of the money required to keep the amenity open in a competitive environment. Lettings remain our principle source of revenue

Investment policy and objectives

The charity does not hold material investments

Loans and Security

In 2006 significant progress was made in terms of the agreement of a formal Schedule of Loans and Repayment terms with Hereford Diocesan Board of Finance (HDBF) As part of this agreement a charge was arranged on the property

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES RESPONSIBILITIES

The trustees (who are also the directors of Bishop Mascall Centre Foundation for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in business

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for freehold properties which are stated at most recent market valuation, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standards for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006, the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (2005) and the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008

Exemption from preparing a cash flow statement

Exemption has been taken from preparing a cash flow statement on the grounds that the charitable company qualifies as a small charitable company

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. Income from covenants and donations are recognised on receipt

The charity's income and surplus were derived from continuing operations during the current and previous year No operations have been acquired or discontinued during these two periods

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category

Irrecoverable VAT is charged as a cost to the SOFA

Pension costs

The Foundation makes pension contributions for employees into defined contributions schemes with Zurich Assurance Ltd and Friends Provident Pension costs are recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities when they become payable

Donations, grants and allowances

Donations, grants and allowances are included gross in the Statement of Financial Activities Hereford Diocesan Board of Finance paid the salary of the Centre Director (who is appointed by the BMC Board) and this amount is shown gross, as income and resources expended in the accounts

Allocation and apportionment of costs

The trustees have allocated the support costs on a floor space, staff time and usage basis, which they deem to be most accurate

Tangible fixed assets

With the exception of freehold property, tangible fixed assets costing more than £200 are capitalised and stated at cost less depreciation which is charged at annual rates calculated to spread the cost (less anticipated residual disposal value) of each asset evenly over its expected useful life as follows

Fixtures and Fittings

10% to 20%

Unrealised gains and losses, in respect of revalued property, are taken to the Statement of Financial Activities

Freehold property is carried at most recent valuation and therefore are not depreciated

Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value

Taxation

The Company is a registered charity and therefore is not generally liable to taxation

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity

Restricted fund income is applied in accordance with restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the Charity for particular purposes

Permanent endowment relates to assets held on behalf of Bishop Mascall Centre Trust, charity number 1062117

Designated fund income is allocated for a specific purpose as determined by the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity

Consolidation

The assets of the Trust have been incorporated into the accounts as identified in the permanent endowment column. There are no incoming resources or resources expended in respect of the Trust.

20. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

The Hereford Diocesan Board of Finance (HDBF) has some common Trustees with the Bishop Mascall Centre Foundation (BMCF) During 2006 a legal document was drawn up and signed by HDBF and BMCF as a framework for the existing borrowing
It contains a schedule of loans, a legal charge over BMCF property and a repayment timetable

A portion of the charity's income is derived from a grant from HDBF, this amounted to £21,000 (2009 £27,000). This grant has been used over many years to provide the salary of the Centre Director and as a matter of convenience has therefore been paid directly, it has always been recorded in the audited annual accounts. There is no stipulation as to how it is to be spent but at present it is hoped to use it both for development work and also for one or two major items around the Centre.

21. APB ETHICAL STANDARD - PROVISIONS AVAILABLE FOR SMALL ENTITIES

In common with many other businesses of our size and nature we use our auditors to prepare and submit returns to the tax authorities and assist with the preparation of the financial statements

22. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

Ludlow Conference Centre has received planning permission to extend and refurbish its existing accommodation. The estimated cost of the project will be £512,000, which £408,000 will be funded through grants

Ludlow Conference Centre are in negotiations to sell the directors house for £290,000 with the balance between sale and costs being used to fund aforementioned development

23. DESIGNATED FUNDS

Included within unrestricted funds is a £2,000 grant from Shropshire Council This has been allocated specifically to cover lighting repairs to be carried out in 2011
