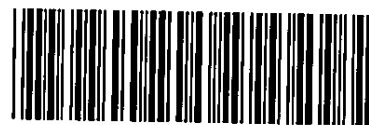

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Cash flow statement
