STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

(a) Governing document

Sandwell Community Information and Participation Service Limited (formerly known as Sandwell Tenants and Residents Federation Limited) achieved charitable status on 28 May 2003 (registered number 1097702) and is a company limited by guarantee (registered number 3071683).

(b) Organisational structure

Sandwell Community Information and Participation Service Limited (SCIPS) has a management committee of up to 15 members who meet regularly and are responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the charity.

A scheme of delegation is in place and day to day responsibility for the provision of services rests with a manager, Jan Macmillan who is responsible for ensuring that the charity delivers the services specified. The manager has responsibility for ensuring the day to day operational management of the charity, individual supervision of the staff team and ensuring that the staff team continue to develop their skills and working practices in line with good practice.

(c) Appointment of trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association trustees are elected to the management committee to serve for a period of up to three years after which trustees must be re-elected at the next annual general meeting.

(d) Trustee induction and training

New trustees undergo an orientation day to brief them on legal obligations under charity law, the content of the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the committee and decision making process and the recent financial performance of the charity. During the induction they meet key employees and other trustees and are supplied with a comprehensive board manual containing copies of all current policies and procedures. Trustees are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events where these will facilitate the understanding of their role.

(e) Risk management

The trustees have examined the major strategic, business and operational issues which the organisation faces. They confirm that systems are in place to enable regular reports to be produced so that necessary steps can be taken to reduce risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects and principle activities of the charity are to promote the benefits of the residents of the Borough of Sandwell in the West Midlands by associating the residents, local authorities and voluntary organisations with the common aim of:

- (a) advancing education, protecting health and relieving poverty or sickness and
- (b) providing or assisting in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation.

In order, therefore, to fulfil its objects and principle activities the charity provides support, information, training and advocacy to tenant and community groups in the Borough of Sandwell, thus aiming to provide communities with the confidence and skill to enable them to influence decisions which affect their homes and environment.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

(a) Service Level Agreement

SCIPS have successfully delivered the work programme funded through the service level agreement with Sandwell Council. The aim of the agreement is to provide:-

- 1 Training for tenant led groups and organisations
- 2 Support for existing and new tenant led groups and organisations
- 3 Development and capacity building to groups leading to local initiatives, especially provision of activities and services
- 4 Support for tenant led groups and organisations to develop initiatives and to attract funding to deliver and sustain them.

The Board also successfully re negotiated the lease on the Resource Centre to enable the company to stay in the current premises until March 2017.

(b) Hateley Cross Big Local

SCIPS were appointed as the Locally Trusted Organisation to support the community to develop the £1 million Big Local programme in Hateley Heath and Stone Cross. A series of events were held throughout 2014 to consult the community enabling them to identify the issues that are important to them. A survey was developed to record the communities' views and SCIPS used this information to produce a Community Profile of the area which was published in March 2015.

(c) Lloyds TSB Mentoring Project

SCIPS continued to deliver the Tick and Click project which was funded by the Lloyds TSB Charitable Foundation. The aim of the project is to provide support to local residents around IT as part of a digital inclusion programme. In 2014/15 the project delivered 7 group sessions which were attended by 125 people and 34 one to one sessions. Throughout the life of the project 21 mentors were trained with 15 receiving accreditation from the Open College Network.

(d) Soho Victoria Friends and Neighbours

SCIPS supported the Board of Soho Victoria Friends and Neighbours throughout 2014/15. In May they secured funding from a national programme to develop an operational plan exploring how the community could be more involved in delivering local services. SCIPS provided a co-ordination role and drafted much of the final plan which was extremely well received nationally.

(e) Cotterills Farm

Cotterills Farm is a well-established tenant management organisation based in Tipton. SCIPS have delivered a programme of training and development with the Board to assist them to re-negotiate their management agreement with the Council.

(f) Community First Funding

SCIPS provided support and managed the Oldbury Community First programme. Over a 4 year period a panel of local representatives allocated £87,000 of funding to 40 groups in the Oldbury area. The criteria required the grant to be matched with volunteer hours and throughout the life of the programme over 20,000 hours were donated with a value of £226,531.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

SCIPS is reliant upon the income derived from grants it receives from organisations such as Sandwell Metropolitan Borough Council and other grant making organisations. SCIPS have obtained core funding for the current year ending 31 March 2016 and for a further year ending 31 March 2017.

The Statement of Financial Activities shows a gross income of £199,766 (2014 - £198,238) and expenditure of £206,008 (2014 - £205,205). The reserves are primarily to cover the development and future running expenses of all aspects of the organisation. The excess unrestricted reserve will be used to pilot activities and initiatives which will enable SCIPS to secure funding for new areas of work in the future.

Reserves Policy

The trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ("the free reserves") held by the charity should be approximately 6 months of the resources expended which equates to approximately £87,000 in general funds. At this level the trustees feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in funding. In addition the trustees have identified that in the event of a loss in in funding SCIPS could have a potential liability for staff redundancy. The trustees have estimated that this would cost £20,000. Unrestricted reserves at 31 March 2015 total £120,896 sufficient to cover 6 months expenditure plus any potential liability for staff redundancy. The trustees have also designated £16,000 of unrestricted funds for the planned provision of new IT equipment and company restructure costs during the year ended 31 March 2016.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

(a) Continuation of core services

SCIPS will continue to develop and deliver services to community groups across the Borough funded through the service level agreement with Sandwell Council. Key priorities for the coming years are around the council's need to save money and to explore different ways of delivering local services using the voluntary and community sector

(b) Hateley Cross Big Local

In January 2015 the Hateley Cross Steering Group agreed to retain SCIPS as their Locally Trusted Organisation for the next phase of the project. SCIPS will continue to deliver events and activities on behalf of the programme and assist the Steering Group to appoint a plan writer to produce their Big Local Plan.

(c) Business Planning

SCIPS current Business Plan runs out at the end of 2015. The Board will be delivering a programme of consultation and development to produce a new business plan which will be launched at the organisations AGM in 2016.

(d) Your Value!

SCIPS have retained the Investor in People award for 15 years. The organisation is due for reassessment in September 2015. The Board decided to look for a quality mark that measured the social impact of the organisation. The Your Value! package was identified and the company will be developing this approach through 2015.

(e) Cotterills Farm

The Cotterills Farm Board have commissioned SCIPS to deliver a community development programme to encourage more people to get involved in the work of the organisation.

(f) Soho Victoria Friends and Neighbours

SCIPS will be continuing its work with the Board of Soho Victoria Friends and Neighbours to develop a transitional plan that will enable the group to be more self-sustaining. In addition SCIPS will be leading a governance review on behalf of the organisation.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005).

Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is small.

Company status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the trustees named on the members of the board page. In the event of the charity being wound up the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise of unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes:-

unconditionally entitled to the grant. Grants, where related performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by performance,

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified,

Investment income is included where receivable.

Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the cost of trading for fundraising purposes.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include accountancy fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the statement of financial activities on the basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
