Structure, governance and management

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and was formed on 9 October 2007. It is governed by a memorandum and articles of association as amended by special resolutions on 1 October 2012 and 9 October 2012. The liability of the members in the event of the company being wound up is limited to a sum not exceeding £10. The company was registered as a charity on 11 October 2012.

Method of recruitment and appointment of trustees

The trustees of the charity are also the directors for the purposes of company law and are appointed by the members at the AGM.

Trustee remuneration

During the period no trustees received any remuneration or expenses in respect of their attendance at board meetings or any other activities in relation to the charity.

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects

- (1) To further such charitable purposes falling within the description of charitable purposes. Being the advancement of citizenship or community development Charitable purposes that fall within this description being:
- a) The promotion of good citizenship and civic responsibility.
- b) The promotion of urban and rural regeneration.
- c) The promotion of volunteering for the public benefit.
- d) The promotion of the voluntary sector for the public benefit.
- e) Promoting the efficiency and effectiveness of charities and the effective use of charitable resources.
- f) The promotion of community capacity building; and by promoting or advancing exclusively charitable purposes of charities involved with social investment.
- (2) To advance education and training for the public benefit.
- (3) To relieve those in need and to promote social inclusion for the public benefit by preventing people from becoming socially excluded, relieving the needs of those people who are socially excluded and assisting them to integrate into society "Socially excluded" means being excluded from society, or part of society, as a result of being a member of a socially and economically deprived community by undertaking charitable activities which assist those by reason of their age, ill-health, disability, financial hardship or other disadvantage.
- (4) To protect and preserve the environment for the public benefit by the promotion of waste reduction, refuse reclamation, recycling, the re-use and repair of recycled products and the use of surplus.
- (5) To further such other charitable purposes as the trustees may determine from time to time. The aim being to address the well-being of socially and economically disadvantaged communities in Leeds. 'Well-being' shall mean ensuring the basic needs of individuals and the community are met in relation to health, education, financial security, employment, the built environment and access to public services, amenities and recreation facilities.

The charity's main activities

To carry on activities which benefit the community and in particular (without limitation) to contribute to the social, environmental and economic well-being of the people of South Leeds by setting up not for profit social enterprise businesses with environmental and social aims which offer work opportunities to people with learning and other difficulties.

Public benefit statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our Trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

Achievements and performance

Furniture Operation

South Leeds Alternative Trading Enterprise has continued during the past year to operate The Feel Good Furniture Shop on Low Road in Hunslet, Leeds. We opened a second furniture shop in Armley in March 2015 Both shops allows us to continue to supply affordable used furniture and electrical items to people in need in South Leeds and surrounding areas rather than these items going to landfill. The shop has experienced a large increase in demand for its goods during the last year and this is in part due to the efforts of the staff and volunteers that work hard to offer a good service to our customers.

Our shop would not exist without the generous people who donate their unwanted, pre-loved furniture. We Continue to provide free collection of quality used furniture, helping people de-clutter their houses, dispose of "old" things when they are buying new, or find a home for a deceased relative's treasured possessions.

Catering Operation

The Feel Good Café that we established in Beeston has gone from strength to strength. It allows us to offer training and volunteering in catering to adults with learning disabilities and other members of the local community. We are also running community cooking classes to help educate local families about the benefits of freshly prepared meals.

<u>Volunteers</u>

We continue to provide volunteering and employment for people with Learning Disabilities. We have continued to support two ring fenced posts for adults with learning disabilities to work as driver's mate assisting with the delivery and collection of our furniture and other items. We also support a number of volunteers with learning disabilities to experience a work style environment that is supportive and encouraging to build their confidence and work related skills. We have also continued to offer volunteering opportunities to people with mental health issues and other disabilities to ensure that they can increase their skills, confidence and employability.

Plans For The Future

We aim to grow all our retail outlets to ensure that they become established in the local community. We hope that this will allow us to offer more training, employment and volunteering opportunities to people with learning disabilities and other difficulties. We are working towards replacing our Adult Social Care grant with clients on the Direct Payment scheme this will dove tail with our plans to integrate a new training centre for our volunteers into our Warehouse in Hunslet and are currently actively seeking funding for this.

Finance

The growth in Furniture sales has seen our trading income grow over this past year. We are grateful to all funders that have given us grants over the past year including Leeds City Council Adult Social Care, Leeds City Council Leeds Inspired Fund, Leeds Community Foundation through the Yorkshire Venture Philanthropy Large Grant Fund, The People's Health Trust; and Leeds City Council members Inner Area South Committee for their continued support. We would also like to thank The Key Fund for their continuing finance and investment support.

Financial review

The net income for the year was £30,719, including net income of £8,185 on unrestricted funds and net income of £22,534 on restricted funds after transfers.

Reserves policy

The charity's free reserves, excluding fixed assets, at the year end were £137,316.

The trustees aim to maintain sufficient reserve funds to cover between 3 and 6 months operating expenditure.

Funds held as custodian trustee on behalf of others

At the year end the charity was holding £2,500 on behalf of the Leeds Furniture Reuse Group (LFRG). This sum has been excluded from the charity's bank balance in the balance sheet as per the Charities SORP guidance.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees (who are also the directors for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Trustees report and the financial statements in accordance with the applicable law and UK Accounting Standards.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for the year. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;

observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;

make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

state whether applicable UK accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;

prepare the accounts on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial accounts comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005), the Companies Act 2006 and Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

There has been no change to the accounting policies since last year.

No changes have been made to the accounts for previous years.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources, the trustees are virtually certain they will receive the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.

Where grants are related to performance and specific deliverables, they are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by its performance.

Donated goods for resale are valued at the amount actually realised upon their sale.

Donated assets, facilities or services are valued at their estimated value to the charity. This is the price that the charity estimates it would pay in the open market for equivalent items; or services and facilities of equivalent utility to the charity.

Expenditure and liabilities

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out the resources.

Taxation

As a charity the organisation benefits from rates relief and is generally exempt from income tax and capital gains tax but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the cost of those items to which it relates.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £1,000 are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses of acquisition. Gifted assets are shown at the value to the charity on receipt. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost on a straight line basis over their expected useful economic lives as follows:

Motor vehicles: over 4 years

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the accounts.

Leases

Rents under operating leases are charged on a straight line basis over the lease term or to an earlier date if the lease can be determined without financial penalty.
