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# STRATEGIC REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

The directors present the strategic report and financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2015.

#### Review of the business

Turnover for the year totalled £17,462,188 (2014 - £16,173,102) and profit before tax for the year totalled £2,564,180 (2014 - £2,041,853). The net asset position at the balance sheet date was £5,768,630 (2014 - £5,243,176). The company has grown in the year, as anticipated, and is expected to continue to grow in the foreseeable future.

The key business risks and uncertainties affecting the company are considered to relate to competition and general economic conditions.

Given the straight forward nature of the business, the company's directors are of the opinion that analysis using key performance indicators is not necessary for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business.

The company does not actively use financial instruments as part of its financial risk management. It is exposed to the usual credit risk and cash flow associated with selling on credit and manages this through credit control procedures. The nature of its financial instruments means that they are not subject to a price risk or liquidity risk.

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 30 September 2015.

#### **Principal activities**

Arena Group specialises in hard copy and electronic document management. It provides the hardware, software, service and expertise that enables organisations to cut costs, improve efficiencies and become greener.

#### Results and dividends

The results for the year are set out on page 6.

An interim dividend of £1,402,292 (2014 - £nil) was paid during the year and the directors do not recommend payment of a final dividend.

The directors recommend that the retained profit amounting to £525,454 be taken to reserves.

#### **Future developments**

The directors are confident that the company will continue to grow in the foreseeable future and are optimistic about future prospects for the company and its people.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (Revised 1996) from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a subsidiary undertaking where 90 percent or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group.

#### 1.2 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated).

#### 1.3 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable net of VAT and trade discounts for sales of software and hardware, which is recognised on installation and delivery respectively, and the service and expertise provided, which is recognised on completion of the service and periodic meterage readings.

#### 1.4 Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over its estimated useful economic life.

#### 1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Leasehold improvements

15% straight line

Plant and machinery

25% straight line

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

20% straight line

Leased assets

Over the life of the lease

#### 1.6 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### 1.7 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost, which comprises actual invoice price, and net realisable value, which is based on estimated selling price.

#### 1.8 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of its employees. Contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account in the year they are payable.

#### 1.9 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided at appropriate rates on all timing differences using the liability method only to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallise in the foreseeable future.

#### 1.10 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.

#### Transactions with directors

Mr A J Fitzpatrick and Mr M H Wells jointly own the premises rented by the company. Rent payable to the directors in the year amounted to £126,088 (2014 - £126,088).

During the year, the company made payments of £19,389 (2014 - £19,107) to Radish Investments in respect of consultancy work undertaken by Mr R A Doyle, a director of the company.

During the year, the company advanced funds amounting to £nil (2014 - £430,000) and charged interest of £25,582 (2014 - £nil) to Stratas Business Solutions LLP, a limited liability partnership in which Mr M H Wells and Mr A J Fitzpatrick have an interest. At the balance sheet date, Stratas Business Solutions LLP owed the company a loan of £776,377 (2014 - £774,000), which is included within Debtors; Other debtors, and a trade debtor of £38,547 (2014 - £68,063), which is included within Debtors; Trade debtors.
