STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

AB42 2XA

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

No new Trustees were appointed during the year.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objects of the Company shall be to provide relief to the inhabitants of Buchan, Aberdeenshire and its environs who have need because of age, mental or physical disability, or poverty, and in furtherance thereof but not otherwise:

- a) To provide and maintain non-profit community transport services; and
- b) To assist the charitable work of organisations and bodies engaged in promoting the relief of such persons through the provision of appropriate services.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 5 April 2012

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

2011/12 was another very challenging year for Dial-a-Community Bus.

The organisation continued to work towards developing a more resilient future by helping their Social Enterprise "sibling" company DAB Plus grow its business and looking at ways to reduce expenditure and become more cost efficient within the organisation.

Our core "dialabus" services continued; the shopping service maintains its standing as our prime service, carrying a full complement of passengers most days and the Community Use Service continues to flourish, although the lack of a newer bus did lead to issues until the new vehicle arrived.

The APT service was very busy and we carried a great many extremely vulnerable people to a variety of different care related appointments.

With continued help and financial support from the Scottish Investment Fund we continued to provide 3 Section 19 bus services under Contract to Aberdeen City council. These services provide transport for school children with assisted needs and transport to day care/respite etc for vulnerable adults. In late 2011, due to some issues with the service and rapidly increasing costs creating a loss on the service, one of the contracts was reviewed and passed back to the council. Upon retendering, DACB reclaimed the contract at a more cost efficient price and continue to run it.

Our Alzheimer's Day-care run from the NHS came to a natural conclusion when the ward closed down and all the clients were given outreach support rather than Day-care.

One of the major challenges for DACB during 2010/11 was to reduce our costs. We received a cut in funding provision from Aberdeenshire Council's ACTI grant of 3.4% and we had to ensure our expenditure was reduced accordingly. We succeeded in many areas; reducing our staff costs, our general administration costs etc. However, unfortunately due to very ageing buses and some extreme maintenance / repair issues we exceeded our budgets for maintenance and repair. This led to an overspend of £28,000 in this area; causing a deficit in this year's accounts.

A major fundraising appeal for 2 new buses was launched in late 2011 and in January 2012 we placed the order for a new Fiat Ducato 15 passenger seat minibus. This vehicle replaced our very first minibus; VW LT 46 W136YDS which was taken off the road in January 2012 and scrapped shortly thereafter.

Another challenge of 2011/12 was to increase the resilience and ability within the DACB Board. To this end we recruited 3 new members; Eddie Gordon, Raymond Stone and Derek Downie. These gentlemen bring a great wealth of knowledge to the DACB Board and are a great addition to the team.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

Although it was decided to do so in 2009, due to changes in our Accounts dept and uncertainty within the Banking and Financial sectors which led to confusion about interest rates/investment opportunities etc, DACB has yet to segregate their Reserves into a separate account. The money is nominally separated within the "Fundraising account" until we find a suitable investment portfolio to move it to.

Principal funding sources

As previous accounts, Aberdeenshire Council administer our core funding through the Aberdeenshire Community Transport Initiative (ACTI).

A gift of £3,000 was received during the year from DAB Plus CIC.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Buchan Dial - a - Community Bus

I report on the accounts for the year ended 5 April 2012 set out on pages four to ten.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Motor Vehicles	15% on cost
Computer & Office Equipment	33% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purpose.

A Summary of Incoming Resources and Resources Expended in relation to Restricted Funds is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
