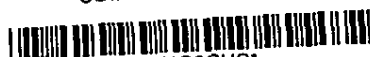

1. Introduction

- 1.1 This is the Joint Administrators' six-month progress report in the Administration, prepared pursuant to Rule 2.47 and Rule 2.110 of the Insolvency Rules 1986. The purpose of which is to provide creditors with details of the progress of the Administration since the Joint Administrators' last progress report.
- 1.2 The report should be read in conjunction with the Joint Administrators' proposals issued to creditors on 5 June 2014 and previous reports issued on 13 November 2014, 26 March 2015, 26 September 2015 and 18 April 2016.
- 1.3 Philip Lyon was appointed Joint Administrator of the Company together with Rod Weston on 17 April 2014.
- 1.4 On 8 December 2015 a court order replacing Philip Lyon with Sajid Sattar as Joint Administrator was granted and a copy of that order was provided to creditors as an attachment to the report dated 18 April 2016.
- 1.5 On 18 April 2016 a further court order replacing Sajid Sattar with Scott Bevan as Joint Administrator was granted. On 5 September 2016 a court order replacing Rod Weston with Simon Chandler as Joint Administrator was granted. Both sealed court orders can be found at Appendix A1.
- 1.6 Both Simon Chandler and I are authorised to act as Insolvency Practitioners by the Insolvency Practitioners Association.
- 1.7 The statutory purpose of the Administration was to achieve a better result of the Company's creditors as a whole than would be likely if the Company were wound up (without first being in Administration). A summary of the Joint Administrators' proposals is attached at Appendix B.
- 1.8 The Administration was extended to 12 October 2015 by consent of the creditors. A further extension to the Administration Order was granted with permission of the court and runs until 12 October 2016.
- 1.9 In accordance with the Proposals a notice of move from Administration to dissolution will be filed in accordance with Paragraph 84(1) of Schedule B1 of the Insolvency Act 1986 ending the Administration. The Company will be dissolved three months thereafter.

- 1 10 Statutory information regarding the Company and the Administration appointment is attached at Appendix A

2. Administrators' Receipts and Payments

- 2 1 I attach a summary of my receipts and payments covering the period from 27 March 2016 to 26 September 2016 at Appendix C
- 2 2 A comparison of the estimates provided in the directors' statement of affairs to actual realisations made to date is also provided
- 2 3 The remaining asset to be dealt with since my last report was the sale of the stock
- 2 4 You will recall that John Pye & Sons Limited provided a formal valuation for the stock and a sale was agreed to J B Armstrong Limited ("JBA") at £30,000 plus VAT subject to certain conditions being met. These conditions were not met and the sale to JBA was subsequently re-negotiated to £34,390 plus VAT. The final payment of £1,723 plus VAT has now been received
- 2 5 The sum of £12 has been earned in interest on funds held with the Joint Administrators account with Barclays Bank Plc in the period 27 March 2016 to 26 September 2016
- 2 6 An insurance refund of £49 was also received for the same period

3. Steps taken during the Administration and the Outcome

- 3 1 In my proposals, I stated that I was pursuing objective b as the statutory purpose of administration - achieving a better outcome for the Company's creditors as a whole than would be likely if the Company were wound-up (without first being in administration)
- 3 2 It was originally anticipated that asset recoveries would be greater than realised and there would be no issues with the appointment of the Joint Administrators. As previously reported following legal advice, I was informed that the qualifying floating charge holder, JBA, did not hold a valid fixed charge which meant that there were issues with the validity of the appointment
- 3 3 In order to ratify the Joint Administrators' appointment pursuant to JBA's floating charge solicitors, Browne Jacobson, were instructed to apply to court. An order confirming the appointment was subsequently granted on 29 June 2015
- 3 4 As a result of these additional costs I have been unable to achieve the statutory purpose of the administration and no dividend will be paid to any class of creditor

4. Final Outcome Statement

- 4 1 A summary of the final outcome of the Administration is attached at Appendix C2
- 4 2 You will note that due to insufficient realisations and the increased level of costs due to the ratification of appointment there was no return to the secured or preferential creditors of the Company
- 4 3 Subsequently there is also no return to the unsecured non preferential creditors of the Company
- 4 4 Further details on the expected outcome for each class of creditor is provided below

5. Liabilities

5.1. Secured Creditors

- 5 1 1 A fixed and floating charge debenture over the Company's assets was granted in favour of JBA. It was created on 15 September 2008 and was registered at Companies House on 30 September 2008. On appointment, the indebtedness to them was £409,627
- 5 1 2 JBA have received no payments in respect of the outstanding debt as there have been insufficient funds in the proceedings to do so

5.2. Preferential Creditors

- 5 2 1 Preferential claims arise from arrears of wages and accrued, unpaid holiday pay due to the former employees of the Company who did not receive their full entitlements on redundancy prior to the Administration
- 5 2 2 Preferential claims have been received for £3,385 but there are insufficient funds to enable a payment to be made to preferential creditors

5.3. Unsecured Creditors

- 5 3 1 According to the directors' statement of affairs, the Company had 31 unsecured creditors with debts totalling £303,793
- 5 3 2 I received 18 unsecured creditors' claims to date totalling £314,747. Unfortunately, asset realisations were insufficient to enable a dividend to be paid in this case

6. Prescribed Part

- 6 1 In accordance with Section 176A of the Insolvency Act 1986, a proportion of the Company's net assets are to be set aside for the benefit of the Company's unsecured creditors where the Company has granted a floating charge after 15 September 2003. This is calculated as being 50% of the first £10,000 of net property and 20% of net property thereafter subject to a

maximum fund of £600,000 Net property is defined as being the realisations from assets subject to the floating charge after costs and after settlement of the preferential creditors' claims

- 6.2 There will not be a distribution under the prescribed part as there will be insufficient funds to do so

7. Investigations

- 7.1 I undertook an initial investigation into the Company's affairs to establish whether there were any potential asset recoveries or conduct matters that justified further investigation, taking account of public interest, potential recoveries, the funds likely to be available to fund an investigation and the costs involved
- 7.2 There were no matters that justified further investigation in the circumstances of this appointment
- 7.3 I can confirm that the Joint Administrators have reviewed the affairs of the Company for the period prior to Administration for the purpose of discharging their duties under the Companies Directors' Disqualification Act 1986
- 7.4 Creditors are reminded that the Joint Administrators have a statutory obligation to consider the directors' conduct and to submit a return/report to the Insolvency Service. I can confirm that they have complied with this requirement

8. Pre-Administration Costs

- 8.1 The pre-administration costs totalled £1,047 plus VAT as set out below. These costs were incurred before the Company entered administration but with a view to it doing so. Confirmation and approval of the costs was obtained at a meeting of creditors held on 20 June 2014.

9. Administrators' Remuneration

- 9.1 A resolution was passed by the creditors at a meeting held on 20 June 2014, enabling the Joint Administrators to draw remuneration by reference to the time properly spent by the Administrators and their staff in dealing with the matters arising during the Administration
- 9.2 Attached at Appendix E is a summary of the Administrators' time costs for the period 27 March 2016 to 26 September 2016. These costs total £5,919, which represents 29 hours at an average hourly rate of £202. Further details of the work carried out during this period is attached at Appendix E1 in the narrative summary
- 9.3 Attached at Appendix E2 are details of the Administrators' cumulative time costs since appointment on 17 April 2014. It should be noted that the Joint Administrators will have a significant write-off
- 9.4 As at 26 September 2016, an amount of £26,177 has been drawn against the Administrators' time costs in respect of the Administration
- 9.5 Charge out rates are reviewed annually on 1 September and in common with other professional firms, may increase over the period of the administration of the case. The rates are appropriate to the skills and experience of the team member and the work that they perform. All staff that work on the case including cashiers, support and any secretarial staff charge their time directly to the assignment. Time is recorded in 6 minute units with supporting narrative to explain the work undertaken
- 9.6 The charge out rates of the team members employed on the assignment during the period covered by this report and details of changes from previous periods are provided below. Specialist departments within our Firm (such as Tax and VAT) have charged time to this case when their expert advice is required. The rate ranges provided incorporate these different rates

10. Administrators' Disbursements

- 10.1 Disbursements are expenses paid by this firm in the first instance and subsequently re-charged to the estate when there are sufficient funds. There are two categories of disbursements, including Category 1 (payments to independent third parties) and Category 2 (costs incurred by the Administrators or the firm that can be allocated to the case on a proper and reasonable basis).
- 10.2 Category 2 disbursements require approval in the same manner as remuneration and creditors will recall that a resolution was passed on 20 June 2014 by the creditors in agreement of the anticipated Category 2 disbursements of the Administrators. Further details of the rates agreed are provided within the Administrators' Rates and Disbursements policy attached at Appendix E3.
- 10.3 An analysis of the disbursements incurred in the period 27 March 2016 to 26 September 2016 is provided below.

Bond premiums - it is a legal requirement that the Joint Administrators take out a specific bond in respect of the value of the assets in the case. An additional cost was incurred when the Joint Administrator was replaced. No further cost will be incurred in this respect.

- 11.2 Further information in respect of the significant expenses incurred is provided in the following sections.

- 11 3 2 The Administrators' choice of these advisors was based on their perception of the advisors' experience and ability to perform this type of work, the complexity and nature of the assignment and the basis of the fee arrangement with them
- 11 3 3 Details of the fees paid to Shakespeares LLP and Browne Jacobson LLP were provided in our previous reports to creditors. The fee to John Pye & Sons Limited relate to the valuation of the stock on appointment and subsequent work trying to find a purchaser
- 11 3 4 The Administrators have reviewed the fees incurred to date and are satisfied that they are reasonable in the circumstances of the case

12. Creditors' Rights

12.1. Further information

- 12 1 1 I would advise you that pursuant to rule 2 48A of the Insolvency Rules 1986, a secured creditor or an unsecured creditor with concurrence of at least 5% in value of the unsecured creditors or an unsecured creditor with permission of the court, may, within 21 days of receipt of this progress report, ask the administrator for further information about the remuneration and expenses set out in this progress report

12.2. Apply to Court

- 12 2 1 Additionally, pursuant to rule 2 109 of the Insolvency rules 1986, a secured creditor or an unsecured creditor with concurrence of at least 10% in value of the unsecured creditors or an unsecured creditor with the permission of the court may within 8 weeks of the receipt of this progress report, apply to the court on one or more of the following grounds

- the remuneration charged by the administrator, or
- the basis fixed for the administrator's remuneration, or
- expenses incurred by the administrator

is or are in all of the circumstances, excessive or inappropriate

12.3. Further guidance

- 12.3 1. IT IS ORDERED that

- 1 Pursuant to Rule 7.10C of the Insolvency Rules 1986 the proceedings listed in the Schedules to this Order be transferred to the High Court of Justice, Chancery Division, Birmingham District Registry for the purpose only of considering and if thought fit making the Orders set out in paragraphs below.**
- 2 In relation to the administrations set out in Schedule A to this Order, the First Respondent, Sajid Sattar, be removed as joint administrator and be replaced by the First Applicant, Scott Christian Bevan, with immediate effect.**
- 3 In the event that any of the administrations set out in Schedule A to this Order subsequently move to creditors voluntary liquidations pursuant to paragraph 83 of Schedule B1 to the Insolvency Act 1986 and Sajid Sattar has been nominated by the creditors of the company to be liquidator in accordance with paragraph 83(7)(a) of the said Schedule B1, Scott Christian Bevan shall also replace Sajid Sattar as liquidator.**
- 4 In relation to all the bankruptcy proceedings set out in Schedule B to this Order, Sajid Sattar be removed as trustee of the individuals and be replaced by Scott Christian Bevan with immediate effect, without being required to (i) apply to the Secretary of State for release or discharge as appropriate pursuant to section 299(3)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1986 or (ii) file a receipts and payment account.**
- 5 In relation to the creditors' voluntary liquidations set out in Schedule C to this Order, Sajid Sattar be removed as joint liquidator and be replaced by Scott Christian Bevan with immediate effect, without being required to (i) apply to the Secretary of State for release or discharge as appropriate pursuant to section 173(2)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1986 or (ii) file a receipts and payment account.**
- 6 In relation to all the members' voluntary liquidations set out in Schedule D to this Order, Sajid Sattar be removed as joint liquidator and be replaced by Scott Christian Bevan with immediate effect, without being required to (i) apply to the Secretary of State for release or discharge as appropriate pursuant to section 173(2)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1986 or (ii) file a receipts and payment account.**
- 7 In relation to all the compulsory liquidations set out in Schedule E to this Order, Sajid Sattar be removed as joint liquidator and be replaced by Scott Christian Bevan with immediate effect, without being required to (i) apply to the Secretary of State for release or discharge as appropriate pursuant to section 174(4)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1986 or (ii) file a receipts and payment account.**

- 8 In any matter where more than one person is by virtue of this Order appointed as the office-holder in relation to an estate, the functions of the office-holders may be exercised by any or all of the persons appointed.
- 9 Sajid Sattar shall be granted his release as appropriate 21 days after the publication in the Gazette referred to below
- 10 The relevant Applicants and Respondents will be entitled to publish in the Gazette one composite notice relating to all new appointments which are required by law to be published in the Gazette within 14 days of receipt of the sealed order and shall file any appropriate notices in respect of the Sajid Sattar's resignations and those appointments with the Registrar of Companies and the Secretary of State for Business, Innovation & Skills (Insolvency Service) as appropriate
- 11 Without incurring any additional expense to any of the said estates, the relevant Applicant or Respondent shall notify each creditor or member (as the case may be) of this Application and any order made as a result of this Application, by way of notice in the next routine report that shall be due to the creditors of each estate (as the case may be), such notice to contain the following matters:
- 11.1 an explanation of the effect of the order;
 - 11.2 express reference to the liberty to apply provision contained in paragraph 12 below;
 - 11.3 in the case of administrations, the provision of all such information as might reasonably be required with regard to the conduct of the administration,
 - 11.4 In the case of liquidations and bankruptcies, where liquidation or creditors' committees have been appointed, an explanation that (to the extent that any information which would otherwise be required to be provided under Rule 4.108(3) or Rule 6.126(2) of the Insolvency Rules 1986 has not already been provided as part of the report) it is open to that committee to require the relevant Applicant or Respondent to provide an account of the administration of the estate, including:

- 12 Liberty to each creditor (and member, as the case may be) of each estate to apply to vary or discharge this order within 21 days of receipt of the notice directed to be sent under paragraph 10 above
- 13 The service of the Application (other than upon the Respondents and the Secretary of State) and the time of the hearing of the Application be dispensed with.
- 14 No order as to costs.
- 15 Such further order or other relief or direction as the Court shall deem fit.

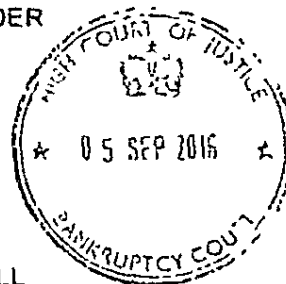

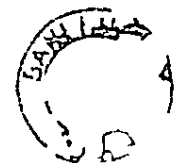

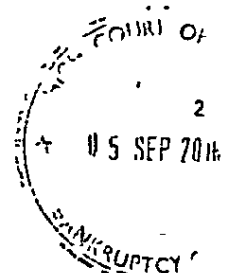

Summary of Administrators' Proposals

In accordance with paragraph 49 of Schedule B1 of the Insolvency Act 1986, the Joint Administrators of Armstrong Brands Limited make the following proposals to creditors for achieving the purposes of the Administration dated 17 April 2014. Approval of these proposals will be considered as a single resolution at a meeting of creditors to be held on 20 June 2014.

- a The Joint Administrators shall do all such things and generally exercise all powers as Joint Administrators as they at their discretion, consider desirable in order to achieve the purpose of the Administration, or to protect and preserve the assets of the Company, or to maximise realisations for any other purpose incidental to these proposals.

- c That the Joint Administrators continue to investigate, and if appropriate, pursue any claims that an office holder and /or the Company may have under The Companies Act or Insolvency Act against any parties concerned with the affairs of the Company.

- e That the Joint Administrators be permitted to conclude the Administration and place the Company into Creditors' Voluntary Liquidation, with the appointment of Philip Michael Lyon and Roderick John Weston as Joint Liquidators. In accordance with paragraph 83(7)(a) of Schedule B1 of The Insolvency Act 1986, and Rule 2.117A(2)(b) of the Insolvency Rules 1986, creditors may nominate a different person to act as Liquidator provided that the nomination is made after the receipt of these proposals and before they are approved.
- f Under the provisions of the Insolvency Act, the Joint Administrators have limited powers to agree the claims of unsecured non-preferential creditors and make distributions without permission of the Court. Therefore in the event that there are sufficient funds to enable a distribution to such creditors the Joint Administrators may apply to Court pursuant to paragraph 65 of Schedule B1 of The Insolvency Act 1986, for permission to declare and pay a dividend to such creditors, should they consider it to be more beneficial to the creditors than for the Company to proceed into Creditors' Voluntary Liquidation.
- g In the event that the Company does not proceed into Creditors' Voluntary Liquidation, once all of the assets have been disposed of and all available funds distributed to creditors where possible the Joint Administrators may if appropriate, file a notice under Paragraph 84(1) of Schedule B1 of the Insolvency Act 1986, ending the Administration, with the Company being dissolved three months thereafter.

**NARRATIVE SUMMARY OF WORK UNDERTAKEN BY THE JOINT ADMINISTRATORS

The work undertaken has added value for the benefit of creditors by enabling the realisation of funds in the estate. The costs associated with the recovery are considered appropriate in the circumstances.

Charge-out rates are reviewed annually on 1 September and in common with other professional firms may increase over the period of the administration of a case. The rates are appropriate to the skills and experience of the team member and the work that they perform. Time is recorded in 6 minute units with supporting narrative to explain the work undertaken.

Specialist departments within our Firm, (such as Tax and VAT) may charge a number of hours if and when their expert advice is required. The rate ranges above incorporate these different rates.

Disbursements

Some of the expenses incurred on this matter are likely to be paid by this firm in the first instance and subsequently re-charged to the estate. Such disbursements fall into 2 categories as follows:

Category 1 disbursements: These are payments to independent third parties where there is specific expenditure directly referable to the case and as such can be drawn without prior approval.

Category 2 disbursements: These are costs that are directly referable to the case but not to a payment to an independent third party. They may include shared or allocated costs that may be incurred by the liquidators of their firm, and that can be allocated to the case on a proper and reasonable basis. Such disbursements require approval in the same manner as remuneration.

It is proposed that the following Category 2 disbursements incurred in administering the case be charged:

- Mileage will be charged at relevant Inland Revenue rates, currently 45p per mile.

All other disbursements are to be reimbursed at cost.

The Liquidators reserve the right to increase the charges applicable to mileage and photocopying during the course of the liquidation in line with inflation or increases from our suppliers. Any material amendments will be advised to creditors in the next statutory report.
