At our welcoming party on the Monday night everyone dressed as their favourite 'Broons' character and enjoyed a wonderful 'Broons' meal of scotch broth steak pie and trifle washed down by that famous Scottish drink made from girders Irn Bru. There followed a night of games, fun and dancing enjoyed by all. There's nothing like a good party to get the week off to a flying start and we felt we knew the 'Broons' so well having 'raised' several 3d decoupage pictures of family members over the year.

The 'Broons' are billed as 'the happy Scottish family that makes everybody happy'. Family members stretch across three generations from 'the wean' to 'grandad'. They come in all shapes and sizes and somehow manage to get themselves into all sorts of bother requiring other family members to help them out.

Many times this past year I have felt the same close family support at Creative Care.

It has been a very low-key year as regards fund raising activities although we did entertain record numbers of young people (450) all anxious to visit Mr and Mrs Claus in their winter wonderland. Also our realistic nativity scene caused quite a stir at Glasgows SECC Hobbycraft Exhibition with animals all made from paper.

But last year many of our 150 class participants experienced great family trauma requiring sensitive support and understanding and like the 'Broons' we rallied round to help support and listen.

As in all families it takes a great deal of effort by individual members to create a happy homely environment. It doesn't just happen by chance. I feel so proud when people say to me 'Creative Care' is their family. We too come in all shapes sizes and personalities all with our own agenda yet the beauty is through our papercrafting skills we blend together for good.

It has been a traumatic life changing year for many yet coming together as we do with all the support Creative Care brings means we can go forward into this new year with 'strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow'.

Investment policy and objectives

The Trustees do not intend to hold investments. Any surplus cash will be deposited in Bank Accounts.

Reserves policy

The Trustees' policy is to achieve reserves at around six months of normal running costs in order to meet commitments and to cover any unexpected expenditure. Reserves at the end of the year stood at £ 1,210 in the General fund.

Financial Review

During the year under review the total incoming resources amounted to £ 35,194 { 2016 £ 45,966}. Total resources expended were £ 41,689 { 2016 £ 43,830} giving a net incoming/(outgoing) resources of(6,495) {2016 £2,136}

The Trustees considered it appropriate to reclassify all major assets under one heading.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

All the Trustees retired at the first Annual General Meeting and were reappointed. The Trustees do not require to retire annually. The appointment of any new Trustees requires the approval of those serving as Trustees at the date of the proposed nomination.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Improvements to property

- 10% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Grants received for asset purchases

Incoming resources for grants receivable for fixed assets are treated as deferred income and are credited to the Statement of financial activities over the same period and same terms as the charge for depreciation. Resource fund grants are credited to the Statement of financial activities in full during the period to which they relate.
