We also received a donation of £1977 from the constituted 'Southern Necropolis Action Group', which was unincorporated, re: on receiving Community Interest Company status on the 18th May 2016, all funds held by 'Southern Necropolis Action Group' was donated to 'Southern Necropolis Action Group C.I.C' (SC535776). Our fundraising page on 'Go Fund Me' took in £54 between 18th May 2016 and 31st May 2017.

We organised an Easter Egg/Family Day/History Hunt (arts & crafts & refreshments) within the Southern Necropolis, incorporating the Heritage Trail, Community Halloween Event within the cemetery, Resurrecting History Project sessions with local primary school (history packs for each pupil), and provision of Gorbals History Bus Tour for two classes and teachers (refreshment packs for each pupil) General maintenance and enhancement of the environment of the Southern Necropolis and the onsite Heritage Trail. Health/History Walk within cemetery (providing medals and certificates for participants), Yearly Poppy Walk, marking war graves with poppies and a poppy wreath for VC Recipient. Research into the history and heritage of the cemetery, and archiving historic documents relating to the cemetery.
