### Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ending 31 March 2016

The directors and trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2016. The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law, and who served during the year, and up to the date of this report, are set out on page 1.

### Structure, governance and management

Hastings Shopmobility was incorporated as a company limited by guarantee on 26 June 1997 and the service opened to the public on 13 January 1998.

The memorandum and articles of association govern the charity and its trustees meet regularly to manage its affairs and determine policy, which is implemented by employed co-coordinators, assisted by trained volunteers.

### Objectives and activities

The charity aims to provide assistance to people with impaired mobility, whether temporary or permanent, to access town centre shops and businesses, usually through the loan of powered scooters or manual wheelchairs. The service aims to allow users to maintain independence when desired.

Free parking is offered in the Priory Meadow car park by courtesy of the centre management, and within the car park there is a self contained office and store. The office is open from 10.00am until 4.30pm Monday to Saturday with other opening times for special occasions. Sunday opening is funded by Priory Meadow Management.

#### Achievements and performance

During the period there were 1544 loans of equipment with several long term loans. At 31 March 2016 there were 192 registered users. The service continues to attract users from the rural area outside Hastings and provides a service to visitors to the town.

#### Financial Review

The present level of funding allows the charity to continue with its current activities but does not permit any development of the business beyond its core business. A small surplus is shown for the period ended 31 March 2016 and this has been added to reserves. The directors and trustees are concerned that the deficits should not arise year on year and will continue to explore new sources of funding to safeguard the future of the service.

Fundraising is the responsibility of the Board and the co-ordinators. The principal sponsors are Hastings Borough Council and Priory Meadow Management. Donations have been received from other businesses and charities. The scheme co-ordinators, assisted by volunteers, have successfully undertaken additional fundraising activities. Whilst grants to cover the cost of equipment are occasionally available revenue funding is not easily obtained. The contributions of Hastings Borough Council and Priory Meadow Management are particularly valuable in this respect and their continuance is essential to the future of the service. Thanks are particularly due to The Sussex Freemasons. Hastings Old Town Carnival Committee have also made a donation.

### Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees recommend that Manningtons remain in office until further notice.

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2005)', issued in March 2005, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006.

#### Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are those donated for use in a particular area or for specific purposes, the use of which is restricted to that area or purpose.

Further details of each fund are disclosed in note 15.

#### Incoming resources

Voluntary income including donations and grants that provide core funding or are of a general nature is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

Income from charitable activities includes income recognised as earned (as the related goods or services are provided) under contract.

#### Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

### Governance costs

Governance costs include costs of the preparation and examination of the statutory accounts, the costs of trustee meetings and the cost of any legal advice to trustees on governance or constitutional matters.

### Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources, for example, allocating property costs by floor areas, or per capita, staff costs by the time spent and other costs by their usage.

### Fixed assets

Individual fixed assets costing £200 or more are initially recorded at cost.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on tangible fixed assets so as to write off the cost or valuation, less any estimated residual value, over their expected useful economic life as follows:
