Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 August 2016

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Activities and Performance

The third year at Lagan Valley Vineyard Church has continued to exceed our expectations. This year saw our Sunday morning gatherings moving as we secured a longer-term lease on a venue we can now call home. We have secured a lease and redeveloped a unit at Altona Industrial Estate in Lisburn giving us space for up to 400 people to gather including purpose build rooms for children's activities. The willingness of our church community to give generously and sacrificially of finances into creating this new space has been a deep joy to experience and this new home has created a whole new momentum and season of growth. Our weekly Sunday gathering has continued to grow to now averaging 200 adults and young people per week.

Notable growth has been in the number of children and families with a sense of God encouraging us to plan for 100 children soon. This growth has seen us invite Claire Harrison onto our volunteer team to develop our Children's environments for ages 3 to 14 which is now called Party People and sub divided into Little Party age 3-5, Big Party age 5-11 and the creation of a new group called House Party age 11-14.

Our culture of serving is something to celebrate with over 50% of our church community now serving either on our welcome team, Party People or in our local area.

This Christmas we increased our hamper giving and the number of charities we gave to. Our biggest number of food hampers was given to Barnardo's Lisburn and clothes parcels were also gratefully received. Support of local Charities and agencies throughout the year continues to be a priority for us at Lagan Valley Vineyard as we keep our eye on our ethos of "Partners before Programmes". It feels a privilege to simply and proactively support the excellent work that local agencies are doing in our neighbourhoods.

In January 2016, we were delighted to help Pond Park Community form a new fully constituted community group and elect a full group of 12 enthusiastic members. This group began managing their own accounts from January. We committed to continue to provide strong support to this group for their full first year to see them succeed. We provide a member to sit in on their committee monthly, volunteers for all their community events as requested and financial backing, strategic advice and moral support as required. It is notable that this July the new community group managed the annual Summer Festival in their own name and secured full funding from Lisburn City Council. Pond Park Community group is developing well.

Our office communication and administration capacity seems to have doubled in the last year and much of this is due to the exceptional job that Laura Arnold has done and we are delighted to now have Laura employed full time. Overall, we are delighted with development of the work and how things continue to progress on all fronts.

PLANS FOR THE FUTURE

With the growth in numbers we have a need to find more space for our children and young people and a need to employ a Kids Pastor to manage and develop our children's ministry age 3-14. We are actively seeking solutions for more space. We have 3 Interns joining our team from September 2016 to May 2017 who will invest their time in children and graphic design. We are seeking to employ a part time youth pastor within the next 18 months working with young people age 12 to 18.

This Christmas we plan to increase our hamper giving to 120, to ensure we give also to an agency that serves elderly people in Lisburn and to create a Christmas gathering of local agencies and charities to celebrate the incredible work they do in our city. We have a dream to think of how we can ensure local people are not alone on Christmas day. To aid this we plan to increase the number of hours that Yvette Wilkinson works for us as City Pastor in serving the city. We also plan to offer Yvette a 3 month sabbatical in the summer of 2017 as a time of rest and reflection on her role.

With increased growth, we plan to create environments called Tribes. Tribes are where we can stay small whilst we grow big. Small home groups meeting by-weekly on a week night and providing community, biblical learning, worship and ways to serve together in our neighbourhoods or an outward focus. These will culminate in the summer term with Tribe Tours where teams can choose to serve internationally or locally.

Starting this September is "Compass" which combines weekend intensives, encouraging practical application of God's Kingdom in chosen areas of business, family & community, arts & design, political & civic affairs, healthcare or education.

We plan to partner with Westminster Theological Centre to host their Northern Irish hub, offering undergraduate and post graduate courses in Kingdom Theology, hopefully starting September 2017.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 August 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc

- 15% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
