NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of freehold land and buildings and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

Throughout the year the company experienced a significant downturn in it's trade. In response to this the company underwent a substantial re-structuring of it's downstream supply activities. This has resulted in significant operating efficiences and substantial cost savings being realised. The company has also undergone a significant amount of prospecting for substantial large scale projects during the year. The directors feel strongly that, as a result, the company will secure a number of substantial large scale projects during the latter half of 2010. This would result in a significant upswing in the company's trading activities.

After the balance sheet date the company's bankers agreed to continue their financial support of the company for the foreseeable future

On the basis of the above, the directors feel that the preparation of these financial statements using the going concern assumption is appropriate

12 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts

1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows.

Land and buildings Freehold

4% straight line

Plant and machinery

33% straight line

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

20 / 33 1/3% straight line

Motor vehicles

25% straight line

The part of the annual depreciation charge on revalued assets which relates to the revaluation surplus is transferred from the revaluation reserve to the profit and loss account

14 Stock and work in progress

Stock and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value

15 Deferred taxation

Deferred tax arises as a result of including items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the company's accounts. Deferred tax is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation to pay more (or less) tax at a future date, at the average tax rates that are expected to apply when the timing differences reverse, based on current tax rates and laws
