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Directors' report For the year ended 31 December 2008

Principal Activity

The principal activities of the company are to advance the Christian faith and also to promote general community activities.

Review of year

2008 was a good year in the whole area of work, ministry and development of New Springs UK. However with the national economic downturn it was a financial challenge.

The Directors/Trustees formally convened on no less than 8 occasions throughout the year. These officers have responsibility for overseeing the whole of the organisation ensuring all the organisation's primary objectives are fulfilled, as well as overseeing the legal and financial aspects of the organisation. The elders of New Springs, however, oversee the spiritual aspects of the organisation on a weekly basis.

Nationally

The national network of ministers and Christian leaders continued to grow throughout the year. The CEO met with individual ministers and also with small groups every month. Our goal has continued to be to assist other like-minded charitable organisations in a consultative way as well in many practical areas. We were also able to initiate an Emerging Leader's Forum called the Caleb Group.

There have been 14 cluster group gatherings held up and down the UK.

We celebrated our 11th anniversary with a special banquet with 200 guests and a weekend of further celebrations.

Locally

In 2008 the organisation saw growth both numerically in the main church services but also in the various ministries and activities we were able to offer.

The church's social programme, international work and youth programmes have continued to bring a considerable impact to the people we minister to and assist. Furthermore the church staged various successful events throughout the year such as the Passover, the Annual Gala Banquet and several Baptismal Services. Weekly Sunday morning services and mid-week home groups and prayer meetings continued throughout the year. We were able to stage several special Gospel power meetings throughout the year with particular success. We also published 20,000 full colour magazines that were delivered to every house in Loughborough.

Another Building Facility

We were able to acquire more leased premises for a 5 year period. These premises are located directly opposite our existing building, which we have also retained. Thus we have much more space to house our ever growing base of activities. Acquiring the new facility will undoubtedly lead to further growth in the future.

Children's Work

Our children's and youth ministry has seen considerable growth in several areas. Kidz City, our Sunday school programme, saw excellent progress. The youth team were also able to start a weekly peer support group for young people between the ages of 12-16 which has been a great success. The team also took 20+ young people away on a residential weekend to an adventure centre in Derbyshire.

Jobels@707

We launched a regular alternative service called Jobels@707 on Sunday evenings which has proved extremely popular with an excellent number in attendance. In total we hosted 15 such special alternative services.

The Future

2008 was an extremely busy year but the Directors feel that though challenging at times it was most rewarding and real progress was made throughout the year.

As for the future:-

- We will continue staging a significant number of Gospel power meetings and missions.
- The national network will stage a leadership conference specifically for equipping the lay leaders within the network around the country.
- 2009 will see New Springs partnering with another Pentecostal church movement known as Elim, which we believe
 will be most beneficial to both New Springs and Elim. This will give our organisation a wider platform to operate
 from.
- New Springs will celebrate its 12th anniversary with a major community banquet which will be held in one of the large hotels in the area.
- We will conduct a series of Pastors' Tables to ensure communication channels remain wide open with the staff, volunteers and adherents of New Springs.
- We will continue taking on tour our "Life is a Cabaret" gospel show.
- · We will run several Alpha Courses as well as a Marriage Enrichment course
- We will stage a large Victorian Christmas programme that will include a 2 hour professional community pantomime.

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- We will introduce a new weekly children's club called Alive and Kicking for 7-12 year olds.
- We will once again take a group of young people away for a residential weekend.
- We will host several unique ladies events and initiate a specific ladies ministry.

We see no reason why the organisation shouldn't continue to see real expansion and growth in the year ahead.

Reserves

The Directors have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ('the free reserves') held by the charity should be between 3 and 6 months of the resources expended, which equates to £55,000 to £110,000 in general funds. At this level, the Board feel that they would be able to continue the current activities of the charity in the event of a significant drop in income. At present the free reserves amount £43,286 and therefore the target level has not been reached. The Board are considering ways in which additional unrestricted funds can be raised.

Risk review

The Directors have embarked upon a review of the major risks to which the charity is exposed and systems have been established to mitigate those risks. Significant external risks to income are continually reviewed to ensure that sufficient funds are in place. Internal risks are minimised by the implementation of procedures for authorisation of all transactions to ensure consistent quality of delivery for all operational aspects of the charity. These procedures are periodically reviewed to ensure that they still meet the needs of the charity.

Trustee recruitment induction and training

New Springs UK Limited carries out an annual skills audit of current Trustees which identifies knowledge gaps within the board and then actively takes steps to recruit Trustees accordingly.

New Directors will become familiar with the practical work of the charity after reading the Annual Report and will have received a copy of the Memorandum and Articles and the latest financial reports. They will also meet with the Chief Executive and existing Directors as well as being offered opportunities to visit with the staff team.

Additionally, they are invited to attend induction training which covers the following areas:

- Training and Support
- Roles and Responsibilities
- Knowledge
- Communication
- Best Practice Guides

All Directors are then signposted to any other relevant training throughout the year.

Notes to the financial statements For the year ended 31 December 2008

1. Accounting policies

1.1. Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007) and the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and reporting by Charities issued in March 2005.

1.2. Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

1.3. Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the Charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the Charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received.

Gifts in kind for distribution are included at valuation and recognised as income when they are distributed to the projects. Gifts donated for resale are included as income when they are sold. Donated facilities are included at the value of the Charity where this can be quantified and a third part is bearing the cost. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

1.4. Resources expended

- Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as liabilities are incurred and includes irrecoverable VAT.
- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the company in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries.
- Governance costs represent those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the company.

1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £1,000 are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses of acquisition.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost on a straight line basis over their expected useful economic lives of five years.

1.6. Grants

All grants and voluntary income are accounted for gross when receivable as long as they are capable of financial measurement.

Grants including grants for the purchase of fixed assets are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Grants of £1,000 (2007: £3,390) were given to PACE during the year. Also during the year rents of £14,022 (2007: £9,720) were charged to PACE and expenses of £18,265 (2007: £35,991) were recharged.
