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Directors' report For the year ended 31 December 2004

The directors/trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2004.

Principal activity

The principal activities of the company are to advance the Christian faith and also to promote general community activities.

Review of the year

Throughout the course of the year the Trustees/Directors of New Springs convened on 11 occasions. The work of the organisation continued to grow and develop during the year.

Locally, Sunday morning services continued on a weekly basis with an average attendance of 100 adults and 15-20 children. Furthermore, a plethora of small support groups formed a major part of the mid-week programme. Emphasis with the groups focused on prayer, care, young people, social, self-help and teaching activities. Locally the work continues to grow slowly.

Nationally, the work of supporting Christian leaders and church, community consultation has continued on a weekly basis. The network of ministers that New Springs pulls together (both local and national) continues to increase a number of leadership conferences have been organised by the organisation. The work provides chaplaincy to the University and Colleges and our work with internationals living in the UK significantly developed throughout the year particularly working with the Chinese and Asian community and Africans. We successfully began a regional monthly African Fellowship which has had much success. We organised a major mission in the city of Stoke on Trent. The organisation's young people's work continues has seen real growth both in the numbers who use our programmes and activities and in the number of activities we offer.

The after-school Childcare programme is well established and has proved to be a real service to the community.

The Trustees acknowledge there is much they still need to initiate and do. However, they are generally satisfied with the organisation's progress organisationally, financially, personnel and in its growth of activities and programmes.

Notes to the financial statements For the year ended 31 December 2004

1. **Accounting policies**

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002).

1.2. Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' published in October 2000 and applicable accounting standards.

Fund accounting 1.3.

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the Charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Incoming resources 1.4.

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the Charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the Charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received.

Gifts in kind for distribution are included at valuation and recognised as income when they are distributed to the projects. Gifts donated for resale are included as income when they are sold. Donated facilities are included at the value of the Charity where this can be quantified and a third part is bearing the cost. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

1.5. Resources expanded

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources. Premises overheads have been allocated on a floor area basis and other overheads have been allocated on the basis of the head count.

Fundraising costs are those incurred in seeking voluntary contributions and do not include the costs of disseminating in support of the charitable activities. Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure of the objects of the Charity and include project management carried out at Headquarters. Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the Charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation 1.6.

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £1,000 are capitalised and included at cost including any incidental expenses of acquisition.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost on a straight line basis over their expected useful economic lives as follows:-
