1 Introduction

- 1.1 I, Jonathan Mark Williams of Bishop Fleming LLP, 16 Queen Square, Bristol, BS1 4NT, was appointed as Liquidator of Radish Solutions Limited (the Company) on 4 August 2017. The affairs of the Company are now fully wound-up, and this is my Final Account of the Liquidation, which covers the period since my appointment.
- 1.2 Information about the way that I will use, and store personal data on insolvency appointments can be found at www.bishopfleminginsolvency.co.uk/privacy-policy. If you are unable to download this, please contact me and a hard copy will be provided to you.
- 1.3 The trading address of the Company was 15-17 Church Street, Stourbridge, West Midlands, DY8 1LU.
- 1.4 The registered office of the Company was changed to Bishop Fleming LLP, 16 Queen Square, Bristol, BS1 4NT and its registered number is 07273757.

2 Receipts and Payments

2.1 At Appendix A, I have provided my Receipts and Payments Account for the Liquidation, which includes a comparison to the Directors' Declaration of Solvency. My Receipts and Payments Account provides details of the remuneration charged and expenses incurred and paid by me as Liquidator.

3 Work undertaken by the Liquidator

3.1 This section of the Final Account provides creditors with an overview of the work undertaken in the Liquidation since 4 August 2017, together with information on the overall outcome of the Liquidation.

Directors Loan Account

- 3.2 At the date of Liquidation is was estimated that the Directors owed the Company £562,555, per the Declaration of Solvency. On investigation it was determined that the actual indebtedness at the date of Liquidation was £564,966.99.
- Following a full reconciliation of the Company's bank account up to the date of closure, it was determined that the final balance of the loan account was £565,447.07.
- 3.4 Over the course of the Liquidation, the Directors settled the Company's final Corporation Tax liability of £5,063.20, bank charges totalling £192.23, professional fees for £1,200, the one admitted claim in the Liquidation for £29.85, the statutory interest arising on that claim for £21.77 and the Liquidator's fees for £5,374.20. These payments reduced the loan account balance to £553,565.82.
- 3.5 The loan account balance was distributed to the shareholders by way of two distributions in specie. The first distribution was declared on 23 March 2018, which was an interim distribution for £30,000, declared when the final balance of the loan account was not determined.
- 3.6 The second distribution was declared on 4 May 2018, which was for £523,565.82, being the balance of the loan account once the final indebtedness had been properly determined.

Bank Interest Gross

3.1 Interest totalling £12.33 was earned on funds held in the Company's bank account over the course of the Liquidation. On 4 May 2018 the interest was distributed to the shareholders by way of a distribution in specie.

Unrealisable Assets

3.2 I do not consider there to be any assets of the Company that remain unrealised at the date of this Final Account.

4 Outcome for Creditors

Secured Creditors

4.1 No secured claims were expected, and none were received.

Preferential Creditors

4.2 No preferential claims were expected, and none were received.

Unsecured Creditors

- 4.3 I received claims totalling £729.42 from two creditors.
- 4.4 I can confirm that one unsecured creditor was paid in full, together with statutory interest covering the period since my appointment of £21.77.
- 4.5 The second unsecured claim for £699.57 was not paid on the basis that the debt had been settled outside of the Liquidation.
- 4.6 The claim for £29.85, the statutory interest for £21.77, a Corporation Tax liability for £5,063.20, and professional fees totalling £1,200 were all settled by the Directors over the course of the Liquidation.

5 Distributions to Members

- 5.1 No cash distributions were made to the members.
- 5.2 However, the following distributions in specie were made:
 - On 23 March 2018 I declared a first interim distribution to the holders of the Company's ordinary shares of £3,000 per share, totalling £30,000;
 - On 4 May 2018 I declared a second and final distribution to the holders of the Company's ordinary shares of £52,357.81 per share, totalling £523,578.15.

6 Liquidator's Remuneration

- 6.1 The members approved that the basis of the Liquidator's remuneration be fixed as a set amount.
- 6.2 I drew £4,000 against the total set fee agreed of £4,000 approved by the members. Time costs totalling £3,714.25 are due to be written off.
- 6.3 Attached as Appendix B is additional information in relation to this firm's policy on staffing, the use of subcontractors, disbursements and details of our current charge-out rates by staff grade.
- 6.4 A copy of 'A Shareholders' Guide to Liquidator's Fees' is available on request or can be downloaded from <u>www.bishopfleminginsolvency.co.uk/r3</u>, selecting the guide applicable to the insolvency commencement date in this case - 4 August 2017.
