Opinion

NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 1994

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below and have remained unchanged from the previous year and also have been consistently applied within the same account.

(a) Basis of preparation of financial statements The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The effect of events relating to the year ended 31 December 1994 which occurred before the date of approval of the financial statements by the Board of Directors have been included in the statements to the extent required to show a true and fair view of the state of affairs at 31 December 1994 and of the results for the year ended on that date.

(b) Depreciation

Depreciation has been computed to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their expected useful lives using the following rates:

Leasehold improvements - 15% per annum of net book value Plant and equipment - 15% per annum of net book value Fixtures and fittings - 15% per annum of net book value Motor vehicles - 25% per annum of net book value Computer equipment - 25% per annum on cost

- (c) Stocks Stocks have been valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
- (d) Deferred taxation
 Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method to take account of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for accounts purpose and their treatment for tax purposes. Tax deferred or accelerated is accounted for in respect of all material timing differences to the extent that it is considered that a net liability may crystallise.
- (e) Research and development Expenditure on research and developmentis written off against profits in the year in which it is incurred.
- (f) Foreign exchange
 Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling and recorded at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction.

Balances at the year end denominated in a foreign currency are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date or the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction.

(g) Leasing Tangible fixed assets acquired under finance leases or hire purchase contracts are capitalised and depreciated in the same manner as other tangiblefixed assets. The related obligations net of future finance charges are included in creditors.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

(h) Pension costs

The company operates pension schemes for the benefit of some of its employees. The funds of the schemes are administered by Trustees and are separate from the company. Independent actuaries complete valuations at least every three years and in accordance with their recommendations annual contributions are paid to the schemes so as to secure the benefits set out in the rules and the periodic augmentation of current pensions. The cost of these and any variations from regular cost arising from actuarial valuations are charged or credited to to the profit and loss account in the period of its payment or receipt.
