We have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing our aims and objectives and in planning our activities.

#### Achievements and performance

#### **Patient Advocacy**

Our role as organisational champions for Staffordshire Healthwatch and partnership with Stoke on Trent Healthwatch have continued to strengthen, through our membership of the Reference Advisory Group for the merger of Mid Staffordshire Trust into UHNM and the Wolverhampton Trust and other cooperative activities.

We have continued monthly liaison meetings with the University Hospitals of North Midlands Trust(UHNM) based on a formal partnership agreement and we are members of their Engagement Practice and Advisory Group (EPAG). The Neurological Clinical Network led by the Stoke CCG lapsed in Summer 2016 as a consequence of the focus of CCG's and the County Council switching to the closed group preparing Sustainable Transformation Plans. This activity hampered any other progress across the local Health and Social Services economy for the rest of 2016 and continues to do so.

The Chair of Engaging Communities Staffordshire (the parent of Healthwatch) has continued to lead a working party of all commissioning bodies, all providers, GP federations, representatives of care organisations etc with the aim of agreeing a cohesive strategy for the provision of services to those with neurological conditions, from diagnosis to death. We attempted to conduct a survey of neurological services but following an inadequate response, we have switched to a program of structured interviews to collect patient experiences.

We are extremely grateful for the continued support of Healthwatch Staffordshire, Healthwatch Stoke and now of Healthwatch Wolverhampton.

Consultations regarding the County Council's Better Futures Initiative failed to materialise as STP dominated.

We have continued to be represented in the champion's organisation for the Cancer and End of Life project being developed by Macmillan and The four Northern CCG's to appoint a Service Integrator for provision of these services.

We continue to interface vigorously with Virgin, the Prime Provider for East Staffordshire CCG and Plus 2, who have been commissioned by the County Council to provide a Carer's Hub. In both we have been solicited to pursue users and carer's concerns and needs. We are beginning to establish an effective presence with the Burton Hospital Trust as a consequence of activities of our advocates.

Our committee members are active in their local health centre patient involvement groups and we are represented on the South Staffordshire and Seisdon Patient Panel and the Patient and Carer's group at the Staffordshire County Hospital. We are working continuously to engage with all commissioners, providers and decision makers in relation to the provision of services to those with conditions across the county. With support from Engaging Communities we are targeting the development of a more effective relationship with the Wolverhampton Trust and CCG's in collaboration with the Black County Neurological Alliance.

These demands, together with the wish to improve our contact with those with conditions and provide for succession, led to our Advocate Recruitment initiative, a continuing priority.

#### Staffordshire Neurological Advocacy Programme

The Staffordshire Neurological Advocacy Programme, funded by the Awards for All scheme of The Big Lottery, is now closed and we are grateful that we were allowed to retain unspent funds to continue our efforts to recruit and support advocates.

We have continued our publicising of outstanding performance, awarding the Best in Staffordshire certificate to a further 3 organisations and have developed our website and use of Facebook and Twitter to support our advocates and other programmes and as a means of education generally. Our Hard Copy Directory project, while well received requires, further input from our advocates to ensure that we get the feedback that we need to develop and extend it and ensure its availability to the general public.

We have agreed to become ambassadors, assisting Healthwatch in communication of STP proposals to the general public while making it clear that we do not endorse these.

#### Financial review

Total funds at 31st December 2016 were £36 (£4,609 2015) of which £36 were un-restricted income funds and £nil were restricted income funds.

There were surplus funds of £694 from the Awards for All Scheme, as agreed by the grant provider, these funds have been transferred to the unrestricted fund.

Cash at Bank and in hand was £573 (£4,692 2015).

#### Plans for future periods

Our immediate priorities arising from the activities described above are to recruit and retain more advocates, provide funding to support their activities and update our literature and other communication channels including our directory.

#### Small company provisions

#### 1. General information

The charity is a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 10 Hawkesmoor Drive, Lichfield, WS14 9YH.

#### 2. Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland', the Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (Charities SORP (FRS 102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

#### 3. Accounting policies

#### Income

Income represents subscriptions and donations receivable.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities and investment properties measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the entity.

#### Going concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue.

#### **Transition to FRS 102**

The entity transitioned from previous UK GAAP to FRS 102 as at 1 January 2015. Details of how FRS 102 has affected the reported financial position and financial performance is given in note 13.

#### Judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances. Management did not make any judgements or estimates during the year.

#### 3. Accounting policies (continued)

#### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds are those funds that can be used in accordance with charitable objects at the discretion of the Directors/Trustees. Restricted funds are those funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purpose.

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reliably measured. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

- income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.
- legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.
- income from donated goods is measured at the fair value of the goods unless this is impractical to measure reliably, in which case the value is derived from the cost to the donor or the estimated resale value. Donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.
- income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the
  contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual
  requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case
  it may be regarded as restricted.

#### Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis inclusive of any VAT the cannot be recovered. Certain expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and has been included in those cost categories. Where costs are attributable to more than one activity those costs are apportioned on the basis of time spent on those activities.

#### Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.
