STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

(a) Governing document

Sandwell Community Information and Participation Service Limited (formerly known as Sandwell Tenants and Residents Federation Limited) achieved charitable status on 28 May 2003 (registered number 1097702) and is a company limited by guarantee (registered number 03071683).

(b) Organisational structure

Sandwell Community Information and Participation Service Limited (SCIPS) has a management committee of up to 15 members who meet regularly and are responsible for the strategic direction and policy of the charity.

A scheme of delegation is in place and day to day responsibility for the provision of services rests with a manager, Jan Macmillan who is responsible for ensuring that the charity delivers the services specified. The manager has responsibility for ensuring the day to day operational management of the charity, individual supervision of the staff team and ensuring that the staff team continue to develop their skills and working practices in line with good practice.

(c) Appointment of trustees

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law. The company was established under a Memorandum of Association which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association. In the event of the company being wound up members are required to contribute an amount not exceeding £1.

Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association trustees are elected to the management committee to serve for a period of up to three years after which trustees must be reelected at the next annual general meeting.

(d) Trustee induction and training

New trustees undergo an orientation day to brief them on legal obligations under charity law, the content of the charity's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the committee and decision making process and the recent financial performance of the charity. During the induction they meet key employees and other trustees and are supplied with a comprehensive board manual containing copies of all current policies and procedures. Trustees are encouraged to attend appropriate external training events where these will facilitate the understanding of their role.

(e) Risk management

The trustees have examined the major strategic, business and operational issues which the organisation faces. They confirm that systems are in place to enable regular reports to be produced so that necessary steps can be taken to reduce risks.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The objects and principle activities of the charity are to promote the benefits of the residents of the Borough of Sandwell in the West Midlands by associating the residents, local authorities and voluntary organisations with the common aim of:

- (a) advancing education, protecting health and relieving poverty or sickness and
- (b) providing or assisting in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation.

In order, therefore, to fulfil its objects and principle activities the charity provides support, information, training and advocacy to tenant and community groups in the Borough of Sandwell, thus aiming to provide communities with the confidence and skill to enable them to influence decisions which affect their homes and environment.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

a) Continued Delivery of Core services

SCIPS has continued to deliver core support services to tenants and community groups across Sandwell. In the last 12 months SCIPS attended a total of 79 group meetings. The organisation has continued to develop and deliver a range of capacity building services. These have included providing volunteering opportunities that delivered 752 additional hours to support the work of SCIPS.

Through SCIPS website a total of 258 local articles were uploaded. These received over 8,800 views and 438 funding opportunities were uploaded receiving over 13,500 hits.

SCIPS Board met monthly and quarterly open meetings were held for the wider membership. The organisation had to cancel its scheduled AGM which was due to be held on 21 March 2020 as a result of the Covid 19 pandemic.

b) Renegotiation of Core Grant

SCIPS grant agreement with Sandwell Council came to an end in March 2020. The Board entered into negotiation with Sandwell Council to secure another 3-year grant agreement beyond their current commitment. In August 2019 approval was given for a further grant agreement securing £150,000 a year for the next 3 years.

c) Reaching Communities Digi-comm Project

SCIPS have delivered several small projects around the digital inclusion agenda. In 2019 we developed a partnership project with St Albans Community Association to submit a 3-year funding proposal to the Big Lottery Reaching Communities grant programme. The programme will deliver accessible community-based training across Sandwell which will build digital skills and confidence. St Albans will develop digital support packages aimed at supporting elderly and vulnerable residents. The full bid was submitted in November 2019 and in March 2020 we were successfully awarded a grant of £326,000 over a 3-year period.

d) Hateley Cross Big Local

Hateley Cross Big Local Partnership gained approval for their 3 year community plan in May 2018. They appointed SCIPS to provide the Locally Trusted Organisation role holding the funding on behalf of the group. In addition, they also commissioned SCIPS to provide community development support to the Partnership throughout the 3-year plan.

In 2019/20 SCIPS facilitated 12 partnership meetings and 1 development day. Specific projects delivered throughout the period include:-

- Providing each of the 3 local primary schools with £10,000 to deliver environmental projects and projects that inspire young people
- Holding 4 fun days to consult the community around the Partnership Green Space Strategy. This information has been collated into a report with the Partnership looking to develop projects using the feedback from local people
- Engaging a consultant to produce a feasibility study on the Millpool, a unique green space in the area, to explore how it could be better utilised by the local community
- Providing Stone Cross Library with £2,500 of funding to deliver a programme of activities for local people
- Commissioning Sandwell Play Service to undertake significant consultation with young people in the area to develop a Youth Voice within the Partnership
- Exploring the development of a community hub in the area

e) Relocation of SCIPS office

In late 2019 SCIPS' landlord informed the organisation of its intention to sell the building in which we were located. The Board made the decision to relocate the company to new premises. In March 2020 the organisation moved to the National Metalforming Centre in West Bromwich. This has resulted in significant cost savings for the charity.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

SCIPS is reliant upon the income derived from grants it receives from organisations such as Sandwell Metropolitan Borough Council and other grant making organisations. SCIPS have recently secured core funding from Sandwell MBC for a further 3 years to 31 March 2023.

The Statement of Financial Activities shows a gross income of £327,228 (2019 - £319,879) and expenditure of £275,544 (2019 - £320,077). The reserves are primarily to cover the development and future running expenses of all aspects of the organisation. The excess unrestricted reserve will be used to pilot activities and initiatives which will enable SCIPS to secure funding for new areas of work in the future.

Reserves Policy

The trustees have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets ("the free reserves") held by the charity should be approximately 6 months basic running costs which equates to approximately £80,000 in general funds.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

a) Delivering the Council core grant

The focus of the new grant agreement has not changed. It enables us to provide training, advice and support, consultation and fundraising to groups across Sandwell. We will continue to deliver these valuable services to communities much of which is responsive and dictated by the need within the sector. We will continue to provide direct support to Tenants and Residents Groups enabling them to flourish and effectively engage with the Council.

b) Delivering the Digi-comm Reaching Communities Bid

The need for residents to be digitally connected has been increased by Covid 19 and lockdown. SCIPS will work with local residents and community organisations to support the digital inclusion agenda. The Digi-comm bid will enable SCIPS and St Albans to develop timely and relevant services to support residents, build confidence, skills and knowledge utilising digital technology.

c) Deliver the Hateley Cross Big Local Contract

SCIPS will continue to deliver services and support to the Hateley Cross Big Local Partnership. The Partnership Big Local plan is due to expire at the end of April 2021. They are required to produce a new plan to secure the remaining five years of funding. In addition to delivering the ongoing targets and projects identified in the current plan SCIPS will be supporting the Partnership in the appointment of a consultant to produce the new plan.

d) Support Sandwell MBC in the delivery of new housing legislation

The New Deal for Social Housing Bill and Fire Safety Bill are currently being considered by Government and will become law in the near future. Both pieces of legislation will require Social Landlords to involve their residents in the development and delivery of the housing service. SCIPS will be working with Sandwell MBC to produce a new tenant engagement strategy which will provide increased opportunities for tenants to be involved thus ensuring the Council is in compliance with the new legislation.

e) Delivering a postal AGM

SCIPS were due to hold the AGM when lockdown was imposed. The Board wishes to deliver the 2019-20 AGM by post thus ensuring there is compliance with both company and charity laws.

f) Covid 19 Response

Covid 19 and the national lockdown has provided some real challenges for SCIPS and the communities we support. The Board does not intend to furlough staff. It will realign services in order to continue to support residents and community groups throughout this period.

The Board applied for funding from the Government Covid 19 Response Fund to purchase 30 internet ready tablets to enable groups and individuals will continue to function during lockdown. We were successful and in September started to establish a tablet loan scheme which will enable members to interact digitally.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with FRS 102 Section 1A – Small Entities', the Companies Act 2006 and the Charities Act 2011.

Cash flow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statements on the grounds that the company is small.

Company status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the trustees named on the members of the board page. In the event of the charity being wound up the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise of unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants, where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of specific performance by the charity, are recognised when the charity becomes:-

Unconditionally entitled to the grant. Grants, where related performance and specific deliverables, are accounted for as the charity earns the right to consideration by performance,

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be quantified,

Investment income is included where receivable.

Resources expended

Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the cost of trading for fundraising purposes.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to-such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include accountancy fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

All costs are allocated between the expenditure categories of the statement of financial activities on the basis designed to reflect the use of the resource. Costs relating to a particular activity are allocated directly, others are apportioned on an appropriate basis.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Fixtures and equipment - 15/33% on a straight-line basis Property improvements - 20% on a straight-line basis
