FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 2001

1. Accounting Policies

Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of each asset over its expected useful life in equal annual instalments as follows:

Plant & Equipment - 20% - 25% per annum

Deferred Taxation

Provision is made for taxation deferred as a result of material timing differences between the incidence of income and expenditure for taxation and accounting purposes, using the liability method, only to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystalise in the near future.

2. Analysis of Turnover and profit on ordinary activity before taxation.

All turnover and profit before taxation is derived from the company's principal activity.

The turnover arises entirely in the UK.
