CHAIRMAN'S COMMENT

After years of cheerful hard work and wise counsel for the Hospice on the Appeal Committee and the Council of Management, and latterly as Chairman, we shall miss John Jones, who left us in March to live in North Devon. I have stepped into his shoes to complete the remainder of his term as Chairman. John Dain, our Vice Chairman will resign in September at the Annual General Meeting for reasons of health and the demands of his business, but will remain on the Council of Management and will continue to undertake various projects. We are grateful to him and to our Treasurer, Chris Windsor, from Dain and Company for the skill they and their company devote to the Hospice. A new Vice Chairman will be appointed in September with a view to becoming Chairman in September 1993.

The Council of Management continues to contribute to our success providing far-sighted guidance and leadership in our affairs. The time and concern of every member of Council is much appreciated.

Paul Brothwell, as a result of whose ideas and initiative St. Giles Hospice exists today, has left Whittington and is now Chaplain to a hospital in Kidderminster. Much of the character of our caring at St. Giles stems from Paul and will always be with us. The Reverend John Martin, who is to be the new Vicar of Whittington, is due to commence his work in the Parish in July and has undertaken to help us with a chaplaincy service aiming to form a Chaplaincy Team with help from other churches and priests who have helped us in the part and during the interrugnum.

We have completed the major extension of the Hospice with the exception of some of our landscaping which is proceeding with the assistance of volunteers and donations of plants. We have completed a refurbishment of the Day Care Centre. Patients have expressed their pleasure with the new lighting and comfort of the Centre and both patients and staff appreciate the enhanced facilities of the Hospice as a whole adding as it does to our capacity to care.

Mrs. Annette Newton, our Bursar, has retired with our good withes for her happiness after nine years of loyal service. Her staff have filled the gap she left and are reporting directly to our Medical Director, Mr. John Taylor. Our Voluntary Services Organiser, Mrs. Glenda Leach, has been appointed to the Management Team. We are fortunate at St. Giles in the dedication and cheerful work of our Management Team and all staff who uphold our high standards of tender, loving eare for an ever-increasing number of patients at home and in the Hospice. We are active in education and training which we helieve is the best route to coping with the huge present and forecast future needs. Training has included volunteers to assist in the provision of bereavement care which is another expanding area of our work.

I am glad to say we have the escential support of the Government through the Regional and District Health Authorities. Our work would not be possible, of course, without this and the continued

support of the Appeal Committee, our volunteers, the success of the Hospice Shops and all other aspects of our fund-raising and control of costs. We are grateful to all those who continue to provide time, money, gifts in kind and their prayers for this vital charity.

1. ACCOUNTING FOLICIES

a. Basis of Accounting

The Financial Statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis of accounting. The group accounts consolidate the accounts of St Giles Hospice and its subsidiary, St Giles Hospice Shops Limited, whose accounts are also made up to 31st March.

b. Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write-off the tangible fixed assets by equal annual instalments over their estimated useful lives. The principal rates in use are:-

c. Donations

bonations are credited to income and expenditure accounts in the year in which they are received.

d. Covenants

Income receivable under Covenant, together with the associated income tax recovery, is credited to income and expenditure account over the term of the Covenant in equal annual instalments.

e. Capital Gro to and Legace's

Capital grants and legacies received are credited to the income and expenditure account in the year in which they are received.

f. Contributions and Fees from District Health Authorities

Contributions and Fees from District Health Authorities are credited to Income and Expenditure account, to the extent that the amount payable has been confirmed, in the period to ν' in they relate.

No amount has been brought in we worth Birmingham Health Authority due to uncertainty whether they are prepared to contribute for the year in question.

g. Stock

Stock is stated at the lover of cost and estimated net realisable value.
