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### Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

### **Objectives and aims**

The principal objectives of the charitable company are to promote the conservation and sustainability of the natural and built environments of the City and County of Kingston upon Hull, the East Riding of Yorkshire Council, North East Lincolnshire Council and, North Lincolnshire Council being Unitary Authorities in England and to advance the education of the public in all matters relating to environmental conservation and sustainability.

#### Significant activities

The main activity during the year under review was the delivery of mobile public surgeries for Hull City Council. These events onboard a converted bus give residents the opportunity to meet local councillors and other agencies to raise issues in their area. Separately, the charity organized public transport for Driffield Show and arranged publicity and vehicles for the annual Education Day held at The Showground, Driffield.

Further survey work was undertaken for East Riding of Yorkshire Council and arranging meetings for Parish Transport Champions. Continued public transport engagement was undertaken in North East Lincolnshire and various transport surgeries throughout the Humber region.

Finally, the charity continued to deliver public engagement work with a new energy from waste power station currently being constructed in Hull,

### **ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE**

### **Charitable activities**

The results for the year and financial position of the company are as shown in the annexed financial statements. The directors are pleased to report that the company has generated sufficient funds received, without any grant income to cover overheads. There is a surplus for this year of £127 (2017 - £473).

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

### **Principal funding sources**

The charitable company has maintained its move towards contracting rather than grants or Service Level Agreements and now receives the majority of funding from this source. The Charity has arranged bank overdraft facilities for £5,000 to assist its cashflow management.

### Reserves policy

The Trustees continue to work toward maintaining reserves of unrestricted funds to provide a minimum of three months outgoing resources to allow for exit costs on a cessation of activity.

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by quarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The charitable company seeks to attract trustees with skills and experience which will compliment those the existing board and add stability to its future management. All new trustees are offered an education programme highlighting the charitable company's history, objectives and the role of its trustees.

### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

### Organisational structure

The directors of the Company form an executive committee who meet on a regular basis. Appointment of directors is confirmed at the Annual General Meeting. Directors receive no remuneration for their duties, in accordance with the provisions of both its Memorandum and Articles of Association and the Charities Act, but are reimbursed the costs of attending meetings.

### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### **Basis of preparing the financial statements**

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### **Income**

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings

- 20% on cost

Computer equipment

- 33% on cost

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

### Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.
