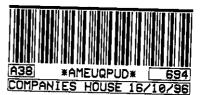

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1995.

Principal activity

The principal activity of the company is the manufacture of deep drawn presswork and other specialist machined products for various industries.

Review of business

Activity levels remained fairly flat in a competitive market with total sales rising marginally to £6,609,534, and profit before tax falling to £74,939. Whilst seeing some signs of a more positive outcome in 1996 a cautionary view is being taken.

Results and dividends

The profit and loss account for the year is shown on page 5. The profit for the year after taxation amounted to £198,691 (1994: £364,352).

The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (1994: £Nil).

Changes in fixed assets

Movements in fixed assets are shown in note 6 to the financial statements.

Basis of opinion

1 Principal accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements:

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided by the company to write off the cost less estimated residual value of other tangible fixed assets by equal instalments over their estimated useful economic lives as follows:

Plant and machinery

between 4 and 10 years

Leases

Payments under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account as they arise.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of work in progress and finished goods includes an appropriate proportion of production overheads.

Deferred taxation

Provision is made for deferred taxation in respect of timing differences to the extent that such liabilities are expected to become payable in the foreseeable future.

Foreign exchange

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

Pensions

The company is a member of a group operated defined benefit pension scheme, the assets being held in independently administered funds. Contributions to the pension scheme, which is fully funded, are based on pension costs across the group as a whole. Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of pensions over the average remaining service lives of employees.

Pension costs are charged in accordance with the advice of independent qualified actuaries.

Pensions (continued)

The latest formal actuarial valuation was at 31 March 1993. Particulars of the actuarial valuation of the group scheme are contained in the financial statements of IMI plc.

2 Cash flow statement

The company's cash flow for the year ended 31 December 1995 is included in the consolidated financial statements of IMI plc. The company is therefore exempted from preparing its own cash flow statement.

3 Turnover and profit on ordinary activities before taxation

Turnover represents amounts invoiced by the company in respect of goods and services provided during the year, excluding value added tax. The analysis of turnover by geographical area is as follows:

The company's maximum liability is limited to the extent of its current account cash balances from time to time which at 31 December 1995 amounted to £558,827.
