STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The Company continues as in previous years with four Directors and a Secretary In early 2009, it was agreed that we would need the services of a paid Administrator / Project Manager to coordinate the meetings concerned with the proposed new Museum Site in Kimmeridge A suitable candidate was found who was willing to move to the Kimmeridge area in order to handle the day-to-day affairs of the Project

The prime objective of the Charity is to provide a Museum which will showcase an important display of Jurassic Marine Life

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

Exhibition at Lulworth Cove

The "Jurassic Jaws" exhibition at Lulworth continues to attract interest although the visitor numbers are quite low. Very little income is taken from this feature but it costs us nothing to maintain so, while the Lulworth Estate allows it, we propose to leave it there until the Kimmeridge Museum is ready to re-house it. It provides good publicity for the Collection and highlights the need for permanent premises.

The Kimmeridge Project

In early 2009, a Steering Committee was set up to ensure all the interested parties were moving in the same direction. This consists of members of the Museum of Jurassic Marine Life, the Kimmeridge Village Hall Trust and the Smedmore Estate. During the period of this report, this committee, along with the Project Leader and Sir Michael Hobbs (responsible for major fundraising) have moved the Project along very successfully to the point where we now have the following -

Final Costed Plans for the building Full Planning Consent Draft Business Plan Publicity materials for fundraising

We have also raised the profile of the Project and brought it to the attention of a number of prospective major funders

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The costs involved in the above have almost exhausted the Reserve Funds of MJML but Sir Michael was able to obtain £30,000 of interim funding from one of the interested private donors. This will enable us to continue low-cost activities for a few months in the next financial year.

PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

In order to progress further (in FY 2010/11) we need to fulfil the following -

Complete a comprehensive Business Plan

Complete the legal negotiations over the exchange of land for the new site

Organise an Archaeological Dig of the new site (requirement of planners) Raise initial funding to cover the costs these activities

Raise further funding to pay for the continued services of the Project Manager, without whom it will not be possible to push the Project forward, and also to replenish MJML's reserve fund Raise major funding in order to start work on the building

All our efforts will be directed towards obtaining sufficient funding to start work on the Building in the Spring of 2011 (ie towards the end of next FY)
