NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain fixed assets, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

Consolidation

In the opinion of the directors, the company and its subsidiary undertakings comprise a small group. The company has therefore taken advantage of the exemption provided by Section 248 of the Companies Act 1985 not to prepare group accounts.

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts receivable for goods and services during the year.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Furniture & fixtures

- 15% reducing balance

Computer equipment

- 15% reducing balance

No depreciation is provided on freehold land. Freehold properties are not depreciated where the estimated residual value is not materially different from the carrying value of those properties. Carrying values are reviewed for impairment annually.

Investment properties

In accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice 19 "Accounting for Investment Properties" no depreciation has been provided on the freehold investment properties.

The carrying value of the freehold investment properties is considered annually by the directors in the light of known movements and trends in the property markets and taking account of the directors' knowledge and experience of the market place for such properties. Periodically, the directors consult with professional advisors to confirm that their views are in line with those of the industry. The directors consider that this accounting policy results in the accounts giving a true and fair view.

The aggregate surplus or deficit arising on revaluation is transferred to the investment revaluation reserve, except where a deficit is deemed to represent a permanent impairment in value, in which case it is charged to the profit and loss account.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Hire purchase agreements

Assets held under hire purchase agreements are capitalised and disclosed under tangible fixed assets at their fair value. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability and the interest is charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

Pension costs

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme for employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company. The annual contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account.

Investments

Investments are stated at cost less any provision made for impairment in value.

3. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

£62,880 (2007 - £77,447) was owed by P Thorne & Son (Safes and Security Systems) Limited, a fully owned subsidiary. During the year, P Thorne & Son (Safes & Security Systems) Limited invoiced Thorne Holdings Limited £16,920 (2007 - £16,920) for management services provided.

The company also owed £47,778 (2007 - £47,778) to the executive pension scheme at the year end by way of loans included in creditors. TA, DR, SK and AJ Thorne, directors of the company, are beneficiaries of the pension scheme. Interest of £4,023 (2007 - £3,863) was paid to the executive pension scheme during the year.

Rent of £6,000 (2007 - £6,000) was payable to the Executive Pension Scheme for use of the premises at 5-11 West Street. The premises are owned by the Executive Pension Scheme.

During the prior year the company loaned Condomdominialista SL £552,510 which remained outstanding at the prior year end. Condomdominialista a SL is a company owned and controlled by D R and A J Thorne.

During the current year the company loaned Condomdominialista SL a further £91,209. A total of £613,719 remained outstanding at the year end.
