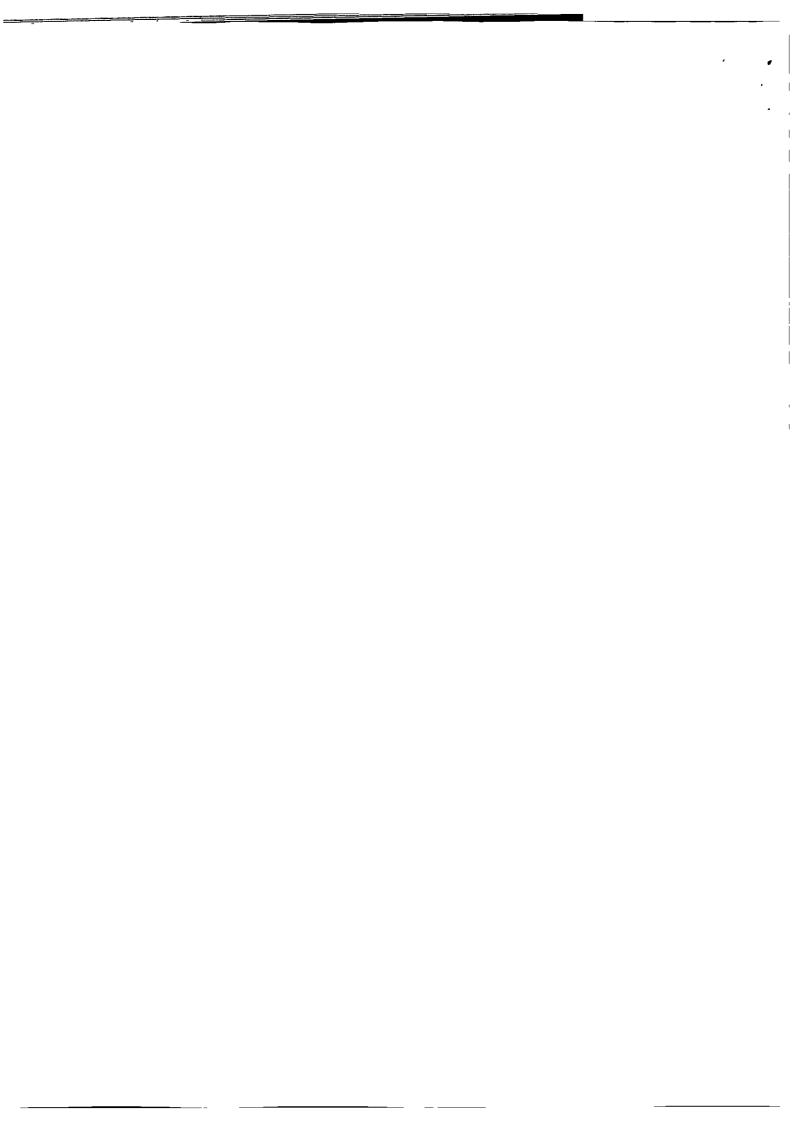

The objectives of the charity, as laid down in its Memorandum and Articles of Association, are advance education and training by raising the aspirations, achievement and attainment of young people, enriching educational opportunities, improving access to education and the equity and quality of education, creating, developing and sustaining learning partnerships between the education, business and public sectors and advancing the learning of professionals involved in the education, business and public sectors and others concerned with creating communities where learning comes first

The charity's aims including the changes or differences it seeks to make through its activities and its significant activities

ABLAZE was incorporated with the aim of continuing partnerships between business and education pioneered by the Bristol Education Action Zone

Achievements and performance of the charity

A review of activities

During this financial year ABLAZE impacted on 5,500 young people with over 800 business volunteers from 70 businesses contributing 21,000 hours to raise their aspirations and attainment levels

Businesses have retained support for ABLAZE programmes during challenging economic times. This reflects their commitment to developing skills in Bristol's young people. Volunteer numbers increased on the previous year.

The main focus continues to be on schools in disadvantaged areas

- 530 primary school children have had 1 1 support from Reading Buddies and Number Partners
- 120 secondary school students have had guidance from mentors
- 53 businesses supported a stage show called My Future My Choice for all Year 5 primary children in Bristol schools and followed on 2008 shows for Year 6 children by visiting their schools
- The Aimhigher programme to raise aspirations of students in disadvantaged areas going to university was successfully run by ABLAZE for the first time across Bristol secondaries
- A research project called Destinations 18 highlights how 11-16 schools in disadvantaged areas receive improved information on past students gaining university places
- ABLAZE played a lead role in engaging employers in the new 14-19 Diplomas
- Partnerships were established between businesses and schools for a range of activities including enterprise sessions featuring role models. The IOD adopted ABLAZE as its charity and led a partnership.
- ABLAZE continues to support school leadership and governance by coordinating business support
- HSBC engaged ABLAZE to run the Pyramid Trust number partner programme in Bristol
- Astra Zeneca funded a programme for primary children, parents and carers to promote healthy cooking and eating across a group of primary schools
- BAE Systems sponsored ABLAZE to support 6 interventions by their staff across 6 secondary schools and a Challenge Day on the theme of Flight for Design and Technology students
- ABLAZE represents the business sector on the Bristol Children's Trust

Fundraising activities

The trustees have widened the funding base to include contributions from the private sector, local authorities and charitable trusts. A positive fundraising strategy is being implemented

Financial review

Transactions and financial position

The trustees consider the financial performance during the year to have been satisfactory

The accounts are set out on pages 6 to 15. The accounts have been prepared implementing the 2005 Revision of the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting and Reporting by Charities issued by the Charity Commission for England and Wales (effective April 2005) and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

The Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) shows net outgoing/incoming resources for the year of a revenue nature

The total at the foot of the Balance Sheet shows the total reserves at the year end

Policies on reserves

The charity's aims require the activities to be sustained for the foreseeable future and as such the charity aims to carry forward sufficient reserves to facilitate this. Core activities are sustained through the activity of volunteers and therefore the cost to the charity of these activities is limited to the administration and coordination. Additional funding for non-core activities is always being sought.

The charity aims to maintain reserves such that it would be able to continue in operation for at least six months should its funding be restricted in future

Restricted funds, if any, are spent in line with the donor's wishes, as soon as possible

Principal funding sources

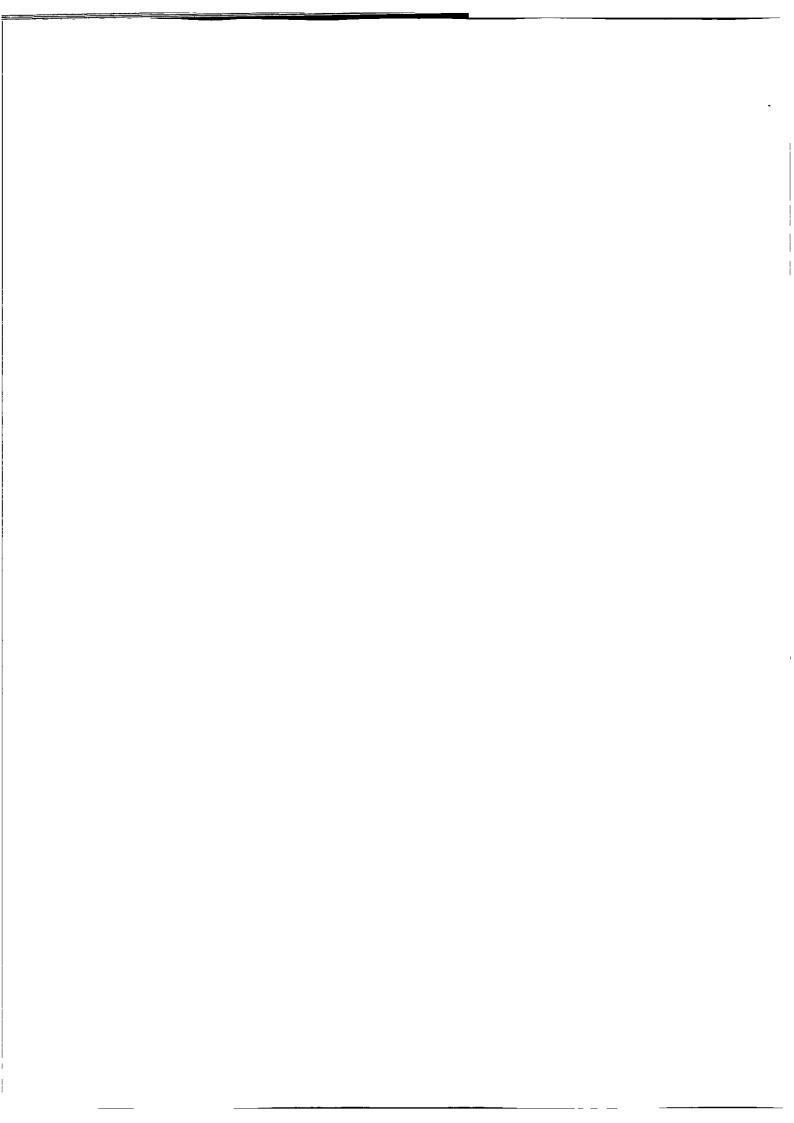
Funding comes from donations from businesses and from the commissioning of services by Bristol City Council Children and Young People's Services

Investment policy and objectives

Surplus short term funds are held in an interest bearing deposit account with a sweeping arrangement from the current account to ensure maximum return on deposits

Plans for future periods

The trustees intend to pursue alternative sources of funding, as it is increasingly difficult to secure private sector donations in the current economic climate. This includes widening the geographical scope of ABLAZE's activities and the first commissioning has been successfully received from South Gloucestershire County Council ABLAZE is also offering its services to the Academies in Bristol which are not covered by commissioning by Bristol City Council Children and Young People's Services

Trustees' responsibilities

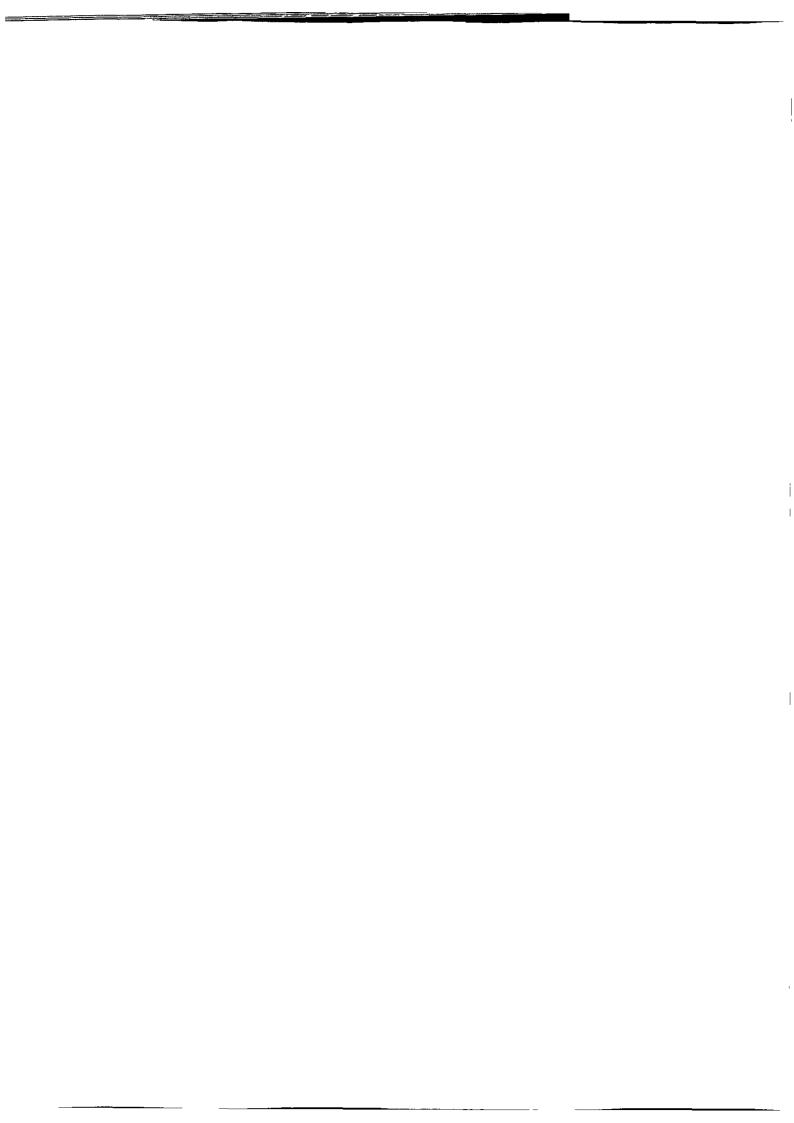
