#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

#### Induction and training of new trustees

Most trustees are already familiar with the practical work of the charity prior to being appointed trustee

Additionally, new trustees are invited and encouraged to attend a series of short training sessions (of no more than one hour) to familiarise themselves with the charity and the context within which it operates. These are led by the chair of the Management Committee of the charity and cover

- the obligations of Management Committee members,
- the main documents which set out the operational framework for the charity including the Memorandum and Articles of Association,
- resourcing and the current financial position as set out in the latest published accounts and,
- future plans and objectives

#### Organisational structure

Wirral Change is a Company Limited by Guarantee The Board Members are therefore the Trustees of The Charity There are three staff Management Team members who individually line manage the outreach team

#### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

The main object of the charity is to provide and improve access to the employment market for members of the black and ethnic minority community

Other objects of the charity include

- to promote, for the benefit of the inhabitants of The Wirral and surrounding area of Merseyside, the provision of facilities for education of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disablement, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the object of improving the condition of the said inhabitants,
- to promote general charitable purposes for the benefit of the communities of Wirral and the surrounding area of Merseyside and to advance the education of its residents of all ages, and in particular to provide opportunities for the afore mentioned residents to participate fully in the life of their community in ways which address and alleviate social and economic disadvantage,
- to relieve poverty, advance education and promote general charitable purposes beneficial to the community in The Wirral by promoting the effective use of their charitable resources and,
- to promote the efficiency and effectiveness of charities run by and/or serving the ethnic minority communities in the Wirral by promoting the effective use of their charitable resources

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing aims and objectives and in planning future activities

## REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the year ended 31 MARCH 2011

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### Reserves policy

The Trustees have a set reserves policy which requires that reserves be maintained at a level which ensures that the charity's core activity could continue during a period of unforeseen difficulties and that a proportion of reserves be maintained in readily available form

The calculation of the required level of reserves is an integral part of the charity's planning, budget and forecast cycle. The desired levels of reserves that are required for this year have been calculated at approximately two months' worth of operating costs, excluding part time staff. This is due to part time staff only being contracted up to 31 March 2011. Operating costs excluding salaries amount to approximately £8,200 per month. The unrestricted fund balance at 31 March 2011 was £19,037 (2010 - £19,113).

Wirral Change does not intentionally carry a surplus of reserved funds as grants are allocated per financial year and usually must be spent within that financial year

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities

#### Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

#### Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life

Plant and machinery etc

- 15% on cost

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements

#### Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the statement of financial activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

Included within the closing balances of some restricted funds at 31 March 2011 are items of a capital nature. These include computer equipment and various fixtures and fittings which are expected to have a useful economic life greater than one accounting period. Therefore, the expenditure relating these items is to be spread over a four to five year period.

The monies received from the grant providers has been fully expended during the current accounting period but the charity is expected to derive a benefit from these funds over the next four to five years

#### Transfers between funds

During the year a transfer has been made in the sum of £2,250 from restricted funds to the general fund. The 2010 accounts contain an accrual of £2,250 in respect of accountancy fees which was accrued to unrestricted funds. However, during the course of the year restricted grant funding was received to cover these costs. Therefore, it was considered appropriate to reallocate accountancy fees to the restricted fund.

#### 10 RESTRICTED FUNDS

#### International Womens Day

Celebration of being a women, sharing information and awareness of services available. The running costs of the entire event was funded by VCAW (Voluntary & Community Action Wirral)

#### Social Capital Fund

Start up fund from the Local Authority for business plan and website

#### Wirral PCT

Health and emotional well-being project. Funding is for running costs and one post

#### Working Wirral

Funding is for the running costs and salaries of the BRM employment outreach project

#### **BME Coffee Morning**

A support group to offer help and advice to women in ethnic minorities

#### Atlas Project

Offers travel advice to members of the local community

#### Football Tournament

To pay for equipment for participants, hire of venue, refreshments, referees, entertainment and trophies/medals

#### **ESOL Funding**

To pay for room hire and a tutor to provide students with ESOL (English for Speakers of Other Languages) lessons

#### Future Jobs Fund

To pay for Future Job Fund employees' salaries on placement at Wirral Change

#### Health & Well-being

To pay for running costs of the charity and salaries

#### Better Together

Funding received to manage the drop in sessions held at Wirral Change

### **Awards for All**

To pay for laptops and travel/stationery and mobile internet for outreach workers

#### 11 DESIGNATED FUNDS

This fund was established to segregate an over-funding from Working Wirral. The Charity has attempted to repay this but due to administrative difficulties this has not been possible. The funds have now been released back to the general fund this year as no claim had been made for these monies within three years.
