MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

Structure, Governance and Management of the Association

The Yemeni Community Association was first established in 1997 and on 12 August 1998 became a registered charity and held its first elections to nominate the YCA Management Committee On 9 February 2006 the Association incorporated and became Yemeni Community Association in Sandwell Limited (YCA) On 1 April 2006, operations commenced through the Limited Company

The Charity is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association

Management and Governance Arrangements

The YCA constitution provides for a minimum of four and a maximum of nine Management Committee members, these members being elected at the annual general meeting by the YCA members. In addition the Management Committee may appoint an additional two co-opted members, however, these have no voting rights on the Committee

Objectives and Activities

The main aims and objectives of YCA are as follows -

- To develop a community based organisation that serves the needs and aspirations of the Yemeni population and the wider community in Sandwell
- · Developing a cultural identity for youth
- Establishing an education and training programme
- Providing advice and information
- Providing a point of reference and access for other groups within Sandwell

The YCA provides services and activities to the community in the following areas -

- Education and Training
- Social Welfare
- Health Development
- Youth Development
- Cultural Activities

Achievements and Performance

Management Committee Members meet monthly to review the performance of the organisations staff and the projects that they are running as well as ensuring that the organisation is continuing to be run on a financially secure basis. In this financial year, YCA has been working to secure funding for the core costs of the organisation as well as funds for the main activities and services the organisation provides

The organisation has continued its good work by securing funding for its core services, Advice Centre, Mother Tongue School, Elderly Luncheon Club and Health Development. On Education funding we have continued to provide vocationally orientated and recreational courses with the main impetus of supporting educational and social progression. We have attempted to eliminate barriers to learning through the provisions of transport and crèche and by taking the courses to the learners by extending our services to other localities within Smethwick, West Bromwich and Cradley Heath

Through Health, the YCA held 19 health promotion activities developed with 939 people attending. These activities varied from health awareness raising events to bigger community events like fundraising health walk, sexual health workshops, visiting local allotments and garden centres, community alarms, blood transfusions services, diabeties awareness sessions and Stop Smoking sessions. We also ran a Lads and Dads programme were we arranged fun activities for dads and the kids to attend 1 e. swimming sessions and various trips. The health worker also maintained information points 1 e. CHN website, YCA Health Website and Health information imparted on the YCA monthly newsletter.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010 (continued)

The funding received through the Big Lottery & BBC Children in Need helped the YCA achieve all of second year outcomes. We have worked closely with young people, particularly from the Yemeni community. We have organised and delivered services and activities that tackle underachievement at school, unemployment, crime and anti-social behaviour, drugs misuse and established a range of social and recreational activities that develop and bring out the best of individuals.

The Yemeni Community Centre has become a base of social interaction for young people in Sandwell. To date we have had over 100 young people attend or access a service which has been organised or established. More than half of them have attended more than once. Our summer scheme attracted 25 youths during our four week program ranging from exercise classes cinema trips trips to fun days out to theme parks and long weekend residential.

Our Centre offers affordable and accessible conference and training facilities. This has been integral in our aims to become self sufficient. Recent improvements include replacing all external doors and windows of the centre.

Financial Review and Future Plans

Funding this year has been very good compared to previous years as we have managed to secure funding for the costs and overheads as well as continuing the level of services we have provided over the years

Overall, YCA has raised funds totalling £376,360 with the expenditure for the year totalling £336,489 leaving the organisation with a surplus of £39,871 This leaves £112,716 in our funds to be carried forward at 31 March 2010

Our plans for the future have been to continue providing the level of services we have The YCA has also started to embark on expanding the Greets Green Access Centre where we hope to raise enough money through community donations as well as private donations and Capital Grants to build an extra floor which would provide classrooms multifunction room and improved crèche facilities. The YCA is hoping to raise £550,000 over the next 3 years and so far the YCA has raised approximately £98,000 (at 31 March 2010 over £45,000 had been raised), which has helped pay for the Architect costs and drawings as well as paying for the successful planning permission which was approved on the 18th November 2009

Reserves Policy

YCA is committed to sustainable development and management practices to support and enhance our activities and ideas in all areas of our organisation. We ensure reserve management is an integral part of our decision making processes. To achieve this policy, we adopt a structured management approach to minimise adverse outcomes in all our activities.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2010

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005 Accounting and Reporting by Charities) and comply with the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2005 issued under the Charities Act 1993 Advantage has been taken of the exemption provided by the Financial Reporting Standard 1 and a cash flow statement has not been prepared

(b) Fixed assets

Leasehold property

The Charity purchased Greets Green Access Centre for £240,000 during the year ended 31 March 2004 which was wholly funded by a restricted fund grant from Sandwell MBC. The land on which the Centre stands is the subject of an 85 year lease from Sandwell MBC. On this basis the buildings are being written off on a straight line basis over 85 years.

Portacabin

Depreciation is provided on a 20% straight line basis in order to write off the asset over its estimated useful life

Equipment

The Charity holds an inventory of equipment held but it is written off in the year of purchase against the specific grant money received

(c) Incoming resources

Grants receivable, hire fees, subscriptions and donations are accounted for in the year in which the Charity is entitled to receipt

(d) Resources expended

Expenditure is included in the financial statements on an accruals basis. Irrecoverable VAT is charged to the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) as incurred

(e) Restricted funds

Restricted funds are used for specific purposes laid down by the donor Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund together with a fair allocation of the management and support costs

(f) Operating lease rentals

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term

(g) Deferred grant

A grant of £240,000 was given to Yemeni Community Association during the year ended 31 March 2004. This grant is being deferred over the term of the lease that is 85 years.
