Report of the Council of Management

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the charitable company is to promote, advance and provide or arrange for the provision of training for employment and in business employment skills or in other skills for women inhabitants of the Moss Side and Hulme area of Manchester.

REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES

The principle activity of the company is to promote and arrange for the provision of education and training for employment, or in other vocational skills of women in the Moss Side and Hulme and surrounding areas. This has been achieved through the guidance and advice service and training courses such as "Make Your Experience Count", "Access Media" and "Women into Construction". The services provided by the company are targetted at inner city areas where women face social and economic disadvantages or are young or disabled.

The company was registered as a limited company on 23rd May 1994, and as a charity on 20th July 1994.
