

Chairman's Report for the Year Ended 30 November 2019

The Ballantrae Trust was established in November 2017 to replace the Ballantrae Development Group (BDG) which was a subgroup of the Ballantrae Community Council. Although we are now a separate organisation, we continue to work closely with the Community Council and other local community groups.

During the year we:

- o Continued to develop our play park and recreation ground, installed a Multi-Use Games Area (MUGA), a trampoline, sensory panels and re-surfaced the seating area
- o Worked with the Ayrshire Rural Touring Network and Driftwood Cinema to bring music, theatre and cinema to the village and installed cinema equipment in the Community Hall
- o Published Ballantrae News and co-edited the Stinchar Valley Magazine both of which are hand delivered by volunteers within the village
- o Maintained our Visitor Information Point in Cragiemains Home and Garden Centre to keep locals and visitors informed of what's on in the surrounding area
- o Ran the Ballantrae Festival of Food and Drink as a 2-day Festival for the first time in June 2019
- o Hosted business workshops to support existing and new local businesses
- o Worked with the Galloway and Southern Ayrshire Biosphere's PLACE in the Stinchar Valley project to re-establish and publicise local walks
- o Continued to staff a temporary office Trust Office one day a week in the Community Hall
- o Explored the possibility of the Trust purchasing the King's Arms (the last remaining pub in the village) as a community hub and running a community consultation to gauge support
- o Started to plan the return of the Ballantrae Smugglers' Festival in August 2020 after a break of a year

This will be my last Chairman's Report - Board member Carol Bell will be taking over from me in January 2020.

I would like to thank my fellow Board Directors and our other volunteers for all of the work they have done over the last year as we have moved a variety of different and challenging Trust projects forward. As a Board we are grateful to Chris Hanna (December to August), Rebecca Giblin (September to November), and Andrew Ward of the Creetown Initiative - a Trust like ourselves who have continued to helped us grow in confidence as a Board, coached and mentored our new Trainee Development Officer (initially Anna Butler and now Fiona Conlan) and attracted grant funding for our various projects and develop our capacity as a Trust.

We are also grateful to our grant funders - particularly the Ballantrae Community Fund, Carrick Futures Community Benefit Fund and Kilgallioch Community Fund for having confidence in our ability to deliver a variety of projects with the aim of ensuring Ballantrae remains a great place to live, work and visit.

We currently have a number of exciting and innovative projects underway and others we would love to get started. The Trust continues to look for more volunteers to assist in the delivery of our projects and aims.

Report of the Trustees

for the Year Ended 30 November 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 30 November 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The company has been formed to benefit the community of the Ballantrae Community Council area ("the community") with the following objects:

- (1) The advancement of community development (including the advancement of rural regeneration) within the Community;
- (2) The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational activities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended
- (3) The advancement of the arts, heritage, culture or science but only to the extent that the above purposes are consistent with furthering the achievement of sustainable development

Volunteers

Our membership continues to grow. We now have 148 members and we are looking for volunteers to help us:

- o at the Ballantrae Festival of Food & Drink and Smugglers Festivals hands on at the events
- o progress the King's Arms Project with knowledge, expertise and enthusiasm for the development of this community asset
- o decide the musical, theatrical productions and films we bring to the village and / or help us "front of house"
- o upgrade the play park and recreation ground decision making and fund raising
- o keep our new village website up to date
- o gather information and articles for Ballantrae News and the Stinchar Valley Magazine
- o by serving as a Board Member
- o raise funds for the Trust

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Fundraising activities

Income for the Trust is generated from a variety of sources including social enterprise, stall rental at the Festival of Food and Drink, cultural activities and other activities. It also includes applications for grants - depending on the project - from a number of local and national sources of grant funding

FUTURE PLANS

The Board's priorities for the foreseeable future include:

- o Continuing the Play Park and Recreation Ground Development
- o Delivering a successful Festival of Food and Drink 2020 and Smugglers' Festival 2020
- o Progressing the King's Arms Project following a very positive Community Consultation
- o With others, contributing to a new Village Action Plan
- o Theatre, Music and Cinema performances
- o Supporting local businesses and taking advantage of tourism initiatives (such as The Coig) to help our tourism businesses increase bed nights and profits to assist the sustainability of the village
- o Establishing and maintaining partnerships with the public, private, voluntary sector and grant funders

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

New Directors are put forward by the members of the company for election.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of The Ballantrae Trust ('the Company')

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 November 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount can be measured reliably. Under IAS 20 Accounting for Government Grants and Disclosure of Government Assistance has been considered for all grants and income will be released over the lifetime of the asset.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings, they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
