DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 5 APRIL 1994

The directors submit their report and the financial statements of The Eleni Nakou Foundation for the year ended 5 April 1994.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal aim of the Foundation is to advance the education of the peoples of Europe in each other's culture.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The Foundation was incorporated on 6 July 1990, as a company limited by guarantee and is a registered charity. During the year the Foundation received funds from a connected charity The Eleni Nakou Charitable Trust and made donations in accordance with its stated aims.

The deficit for the year was £55 (1993: £9,827) as shown in the Income and Expenditure Account on page 4. The financial position of the Foundation is set out on page 5.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The Foundation will continue to provide funds for projects that it considers will further the aims of the Foundation.

CHARITABLE DONATIONS

The company made charitable donations of £137,438 (1993:£73,046).

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING
