DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and accounts for the period ended December 28, 1996.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The loss for the period after taxation amounted to £421,603 (loss of £840,926 for the period ended December 30, 1995). The company paid an interim dividend of £63,818 (£nil for the period ended December 30, 1995). The directors do not recommend the payment of a final dividend (£nil for the period ended December 30, 1995) which leaves a loss of £485,421 (loss of £840,926 for the period ended December 30, 1995) to be transferred to reserves.

REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The company's principal activity during the period continued to be importing and distribution of electronic and electrical goods.

Considerable progress was achieved during the period with the effects of real improvements in product availability and product packaging showing through as the year progressed. Management action and the strengthening of sterling against the principal buying currencies meant that gross margins were returned to acceptable levels. All of this contributed to a significant improvement in operating profitability compared with the previous year.

A new catalogue was issued in April 1997 with 4,000 products, 20 per cent of which are new. This, together with the improving customer base, means that the company should make further progress in 1997.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES IN RESPECT OF THE ACCOUNTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and comply with applicable accounting standards.

Group accounts

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Saltire PLC, a company registered in England and Wales. Accordingly no group accounts have been prepared as permitted by Section 228 of the Companies Act 1985.

Cash flow statement

The company is exempt from publishing a cash flow statement as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Saltire PLC whose group accounts contain a consolidated cash flow statement.

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction or at contracted rates, where applicable. Assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at period end rates of exchange or contracted rates, where applicable. All exchange differences thus arising are dealt with through the profit and loss account.

Depreciation of tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided on a straight line basis to write off assets over their estimated useful lives, as follows:

Short leasehold property

- 10% - 25% per annum

Fixtures and fittings

20% per annum

Deferred taxation

Provision is made under the liability method in respect of those timing differences which are expected to crystallise in the foreseeable future.

Stock

Stock is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost comprises purchase price and all other directly attributable costs.

Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Assets held under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are included as tangible assets at cost and depreciated over the asset's life. The capital elements of future obligations under the leases and hire purchase contracts are included as liabilities in the balance sheet. The interest element of the rental obligations is charged in the profit and loss account over the period of the leases and hire purchase contracts and represents a constant proportion of the balance of capital repayments outstanding. Rentals payable under operating leases are charged in the profit and loss account on a straight line basis.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Pensions

The company operates several defined contribution pension schemes and a defined benefit pension scheme. The assets of the schemes are held separately from those of the company in independently administered funds.

Defined contribution scheme

Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.

Defined benefit scheme

Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of pensions over the employees' working lives. The regular cost is attributed to individual years using the projected unit credit method. Variations in pension costs, which are identified as a result of actuarial valuations are amortised over the average expected remaining lives of employees in proportion to their expected payroll costs.

2. TURNOVER AND SEGMENTAL ANALYSIS

Turnover, which is stated net of value added tax, is attributable to one continuing activity, the importing and distribution of electrical equipment.

19. FINANCIAL COMMITMENTS

During the year the company reorganised its banking and entered into the Saltire Group Facility with Bank of Scotland.

The Bank of Scotland has a fixed and floating charge over all of the company's assets. The company is a party to a group banking facility with its principal bankers under which it has guaranteed the liabilities of fellow group undertakings. The amount drawn down as bank overdrafts at December 28, 1996 was £7,316,000.

The company had contingent liabilities in respect of open Letters of Credit at December 28, 1996 of £455,000 (£2,472,000 at December 30, 1995).

A director of Altai France SARL has an option to subscribe for shares in Altai Group UK Limited dependent upon the results of Altai France exceeding a pre-determined level in the two years to December 28, 1996. A put and call arrangement is in place whereby the company will acquire these shares for a maximum aggregate consideration of FF 2,000,000.
