Ettrick Forest Sports and Recreation Club was incorporated on 2nd November 2010, as a Company limited by Guarantee with Charitable Status.

Purposes of the Company

To promote the general interests of sport and recreation, and provide facilities to support education and cultural activities within all the TD7 post code areas, to encourage people of all ages to engage in Physical recreation, and to promote community wellbeing, offering people involvement in the club whether as physically active members or as supporters or helpers.

Trustees Report: Achievements and Performance

Following the successful founding of the Ettrick Forest Sports and Recreation Club in 2011, the Directors and Members have embarked upon an ambitious programme of modernisation of the sport and recreational facilities available to the communities of the Ettrick Forest area of the Scottish Borders. During the past year, the Club was successfully registered as a charity with the Scottish Office of the Charities Regulator (OSCR) providing a route for the club to receive potentially significant amounts of funding through which to achieve its developmental aims.

Over the course of the year, and in consultation with a variety of sports bodies and advisors, the Directors have written a detailed business plan, laying out the Board and its Members vision for the club and the means by which this would be achieved.

The Club was subsequently registered with Cricket Scotland and Tennis Scotland, affirming the Club's commitment to developing both sports within the community, in close partnership with the local schools. In parallel, the Club embarked on executing the first of three phases of works to the Club's facilities in Ettrickbridge, shoring up the existing infrastructure, securing the facility with a new gate and providing a new cricket practice net. The work was completed by Club members using its own funds, small one-off grants and members' in-kind donations.

We find the club now well positioned to secure the funding required in order to execute the second phase of the development programme, the process of which is now underway. If all goes well, we expect to commence building work in Q2 2013.

With the new school term just begun, the Club will be working with the school to develop both in-school and extra-curricular sports programmes for the children of the community as well as adults.

We look forward to an equally busy and exciting coming year, with even greater progress; both in terms of updating our facilities and in community involvement in sport and recreational activity.
