The trustees and directors are pleased to submit their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2007

Legal and administrative information set out on page 1 forms a part of this report. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the Memorandum and Articles of Association and the Statement of Recommended Practice – Accounting and Reporting by Charities

Status

The Bishop's Stortford Community Hospital Charitable Trust was established on 2 June 2002 as a company limited by guarantee and registered under the Companies Act 1985, registered number 04453584. It is a registered charity, number 1095054.

Appointment of new Trustees

The trustees have no immediate intention of appointing any new Trustees however should this become necessary they would look for individuals showing an interest in raising funds who have free time to dedicate to the trust

Organisation

The Royston, Buntingford & Bishop's Stortford Primary Care Trust are the NHS body responsible for all local health services

The trustees met regularly in a small group with their Director of Public Health and Director of Nursing to discuss fund raising issues

Objects and policy

To relieve patients and former patients of the Bishop's Stortford Community Hospital and other invalids in the community who are sick, convalescent, disabled, handicapped, infirm or in need of financial assistance and, generally, to support the work of the Hospital, when the support required is not available from the NHS or other sources

Review of activities and future developments

In previous years the charity raised funds for the purchase of a Bone Density Scanner for Bishop's Stortford Community Hospital

Following changes at the hospital the scanner is no longer required and will be returned to the manufacturer

As the funds can no longer be used for the purpose for which they were raised the trustees are taking steps to return them to the donors. It is likely that the trust will then be wound up

Financial position

The unaudited accounts of the Trust are attached to this report and full details of the financial position of the Trust are contained therein together with the accountants report to the trustees

Reserves policy

The charity's reserves consist principally of amounts raised for the purchase of a Bone Density Scanner These amounts will be returned to the donors where possible

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2007

1 Trustees' responsibilities

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the charity's financial activities during the period and of its financial position at the end of the period. In preparing financial statements giving a true and fair view, the trustees should follow best practice and

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently,
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with applicable law. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

2 Accounting policies

2.1 Accounting convention and standards

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005) and the Statement of Recommended Practice – Accounting and Reporting by Charities

2.2 Income and expenditure

Income and expenses are treated on an accruals basis

23 Taxation

The Trust, being a charity, is not liable for income tax or corporation tax. Value Added Tax is not recoverable and is included in the relevant charges for administration expenses.

2.4 Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes

Restricted funds are funds, which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

2.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off these costs on a straight line basis over their expected useful lives as follows -
