To amend the Articles of Association of the Association, as listed hereunder, in order that the Association can take advantage of section 249 of the Companies Act 1985 which allows for accounts to be examined by a Reporting Accountant and presented without the need for an annual audit.

Article 14. All business shall be deemed special that is transacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting and, all that is transacted at an Annual General Meeting shall also be deemed special with the exception of the consideration of the Accounts and Balance Sheet, and the Reports of the Council and of the Accountants and the election of members of the Council in place of those retiring by rotation.

Article 56. At the Annual General Meeting in every year the Council shall lay before the Association a proper Income and Expenditure Account for the period since the last preceding account made up to date not more than six months before such meeting, together with a proper Balance Sheet made up as at the same date. Every such Balance Sheet shall be accompanied by proper Reports of the Council and the appointed Reporting Accountants and copies of such Account, Balance Sheet and Reports (all of which shall be framed in accordance with any stability requirements for the time being in force) and of any other documents required by Law to be annexed or attached thereto or to accompany the same shall not less than twenty-one clear days before the date of the Meeting be sent to all persons entitled to receive notices of General Meetings in the manner in which Notices are hereinafter directed to be served. The Accountant's Report shall be read before the Meeting as required by the Act.

Article 57. Once in overy year the Accounts of the Association shall be examined by a properly qualified Reporting Accountant, oppointed by the Council, in order that he may make his report in accordance with section 249e of the Act.
