Review of Activities

Although registered in 2006, the Foundation has been in discussions with Featherstone Rovers RLFC, Featherstone Improvers Centre and Study Rovers to determine the best way forward and maximise the impact of the Foundation's work. That work started in earnest in 2008 after collective consent was attained on the roles of each organisation.

Financial Review

The level of turnover has sustained in the year due to the Foundation obtaining grants, organising fund-raising events and receiving donations to fund its objectives. The turnover largely paid for the performance of projects in line with the requirements of the grants, and the objectives of the Foundation.

Reserves Policy

The Trustees will aim to have a reserves policy of seeking to accrue reserves to six months turnover. This actual figure will be difficult to determine initially until the appropriate staffing levels have been decided for optimum service delivery.
