In forming our opinion on the financial statements, which is not qualified, we have considered the adequacy of the disclosures made in note 1.1 to the financial statements concerning the company's ability to continue as a going concern. Whilst the company retains net assets and recorded a profit for the year to 31 December 2008, it remains interdependent with the other companies within the group. Collectively the group recorded a significant loss for the year to 31 December 2008. These conditions, along with the other matters explained in note 1.1 to the financial statements, indicate the existence of a material uncertainty which may cast significant doubt about the company's ability to continue as a going concern. The financial statements do not include the adjustments that would result if the company was unable to continue as a going concern.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2008

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

The company has net assets but remains dependent upon the infrastructure and support of the parent and ultimate parent companies. The parent and ultimate parent have undertaken to support the company for a period not less than twelve months from the approval date of the accounts. However the group suffered losses in the year to 31 December 2008, whilst cashflow forecasts for 2009/10 indicate the need for additional financing, and potential group restructuring, if the group is to continue as a going concern. Nevertheless the group remains confident that new financing, and any potential restructuring, will be secured and, with the company continuing to trade profitably, the directors deem it appropriate to prepare these accounts on the going concern basis.

1.2 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods net of VAT and trade discounts and is recognised on despatch.

1.3 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

1.4 Foreign currency translation

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.

2 Turnover

In the year to 31 December 2008 18.21% (2007 - 19.40%) of the company's turnover was to markets outside the United Kingdom.

3 Taxation

On the basis of these financial statements no provision has been made for corporation tax.
