DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1998.

ACTIVITIES

The principal activities of the group are the retailing and maintenance of motor vehicles and the provision of car parking facilities.

REVIEW OF BUSINESS AND FUTURE PROSPECTS

1998 saw the continued consolidation of the company's position despite difficult trading conditions.

The performance of Rover Cars Limited caused the directors concern but with BMW's intervention, they are confident that the Rover product will regain its position in the market place and that this Franchise will prove to be a long term asset.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The results for the year are shown on page 7. The directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend.

FIXED ASSETS

The changes in fixed assets are disclosed in notes 8 and 9 to the accounts.

The directors are of the opinion that the market value of land and buildings is in excess of their book value, but do not consider that any attempt to quantify this would serve any useful purpose.

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AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF CRAWLEY DOWN GROUP LIMITED

We have audited the financial statements on pages 7 to 24 which have been prepared under the accounting policies set out on pages 12 and 13.

RESPECTIVE RESPONSIBILITIES OF DIRECTORS AND AUDITORS

As described on page 4 the company's directors are responsible for the preparation of financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion to you.

BASIS OF OPINION

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the circumstances of the company and the group, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

QUALIFIED OPINION ARISING FROM DISAGREEMENT ABOUT ACCOUNTING TREATMENT

During previous years, the group and company received a total capital grant of £300,000 for the development of a new forecourt. The group and company have accounted for the grant receivable by deducting it from the relevant expenditure on long leasehold premises which were the subject of the grant. Details of the directors' reasons for adopting this treatment are given in note 8 to the accounts.

In our opinion the treatment shown by the financial statements is not in accordance with Paragraph 17 of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act 1985 which requires that the amount to be included in the balance sheet in respect to any fixed asset shall be its purchase price or production cost. Given this requirement the amount of the grant should be treated as deferred grant income in the balance sheet and credited to the profit and loss account by instalments over the expected useful economic life of the related asset, on a basis consistent with the depreciation policy. If this treatment were to be adopted as at 31 December 1998, the financial statements of the group and company would include, within creditors, "Deferred capital grants" totalling £218,700 (1997 - £243,000), £21,870 (1997 - £24,300) being disclosed as due within one year. Tangible fixed assets would have a net book value at 31 December 1998 of £4,030,456 (1997 - £3,294,769) for the group and £2,538,824 (1997 - £2,071,800) for the company. The group profit for the year would have been £18,300 (1997 - £21,000) higher.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS Year ended 31 December 1998

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below.

Accounting convention and going concern basis

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and on the going concern basis. The directors consider that the going concern basis is appropriate to the preparation of the accounts because they are satisfied that, since the year end, the group has continued to trade profitably and sufficient financial resources have been secured to enable the group to meet its financial obligations, as they fall due, for the foreseeable future.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is not provided on freehold land. On other assets, it is provided on cost over the estimated lives of the assets. The rates of depreciation are as follows:

Motor vehicles (excluding coaches)

2% per annum straight line

The depreciation rate for computer equipment was changed during the year from 25% per annum reducing balance to 33% per annum straight line. The directors consider that this is now a more appropriate basis. The depreciation charge would have been £62,558 lower if the old basis had continued to be used.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of work in progress includes an appropriate proportion of overheads.

In respect of consignment stocks, the accounting practices laid out in The Financial Reporting Standard No 5 ("FRS 5") entitled "Reporting the Substance of Transactions" have been adopted. This means that consignment stocks meeting the criteria of FRS 5 have been included on the balance sheet and a corresponding liability to the manufacturer recognised. Any deposits paid have been deducted from the liability.

Hire purchase contracts

Assets held under hire purchase contracts and the related hire purchase obligations are recorded in the balance sheet at cost price. The excess of the hire purchase instalments over the recorded obligations represent finance charges and are charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the contracts.



NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS Year ended 31 December 1998

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on timing differences, arising from the different treatment of items for accounts and taxation purposes, which are expected to reverse in the future, calculated at rates at which it is estimated that tax will arise.

Basis of consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate the financial statements of the company and all subsidiary undertakings for the financial year ended 31 December 1998.

Pension costs

Retirement benefits to employees of the group are provided by three defined contribution pension schemes. The assets of these schemes are held separately from those of the group. The pension cost charges represent contributions payable by the group to the schemes and amounted to £103,792 (1997: £99,453).

Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less provision for an impairment in value.

Grants towards capital expenditure

Grants received as contributions towards capital expenditure are set off against the cost of the related asset (see note 8).

21. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

During 1995 the company entered into a fuel supply agreement with Shell UK Limited which formally commenced on 8 January 1996. If this agreement is terminated by the company before it has achieved the volume of fuel sales specified in the agreement, the company will be liable to penalties calculated in accordance with the agreement. At the date of this report the directors have no reason to believe that the required fuel sales will not be achieved.

A performance bond to the value of £42,000 has been issued in favour of Surrey County Council.

Any future liability to penalties arising from the agreement has been secured by way of a charge in favour of Shell UK Limited over the company's freehold and long leasehold property.

22. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS AND CONTROLLING PARTY

During the year the group paid rent of £35,000 (1997 - £35,000) to BG Voller and JW Voller under a leasehold agreement and rent of £27,300 (1997 - £27,300) and interest of £19,363 (1997 - £9,900) to the Crawley Down Garage Directors Pension Scheme, of which B G Voller and J W Voller are members, on the loans totalling £510,000 made to the company.
