AUDITORS REPORT TO D & B TRAINING LIMITED IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 2 OF SCHEDULE 8 TO THE COMPANIES ACT 1985

I have examined the abbreviated accounts set out on pages (3) to (5) together with the full financial statements of D & B Training Limited for the year ended 30 September 1996. NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of preparation of accounts

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

Exemption has been taken from preparing a cash flow statement on the grounds that the company qualifies as a small company.

1.2 Turnover

Turnover comprises the invoiced value of goods and services supplied by the company.

1.3 Tangible Assets and Depreciation

Tangible Assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets over the expected useful lives of the assets concerned.

The principal annual rate is as follows:Office Extension 20%
Plant and Machinery 15%
Fixtures and Fittings
Commercial Vehicles and Trailers 20%
Computer Equipment 33 1/3%
Freehold Property 5%

1.4 Leased Assets and Hire Purchase Contracts

Fixed Assets under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised and depreciated over their useful lives. The finance charges are allocated over the primary period of the lease in proportion to the capital amount outstanding.

The costs of operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account as they accrue.

1.5 Deferred Taxation

Deferred tax is provided on the liability method on all timing differences except for those which are not expected to reverse in the forseeable future.
