REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Overview

Dance Art Foundation is an independent arts charity working at the intersections of dance, visual art, social engagement and artist advocacy. It incubates new developments in dance that it takes into the world in fresh and imaginative ways with a strong focus on public engagement. Performances are daring, often transgressing artforms and in dialogue with other disciplines, extending the boundaries of dance, performance and choreography. Our advocacy work centres independent artists and collective action for systemic change. Our discourse projects foster generative dialogues and widen access to critical thinking in dance. In participation and social engagement, Dance Art Foundation is a recognised UK leader in dance-in-health. Led by trustees Robyn Cabaret (producer), Martin Richard Coppell (curator) and Dr Martin Hargreaves (dramaturge and writer), choreographer Joe Moran, director of the charity, curates and produces its programmes and activities with an international network of freelance artists and project staff.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Participation

Our nationally recognised Breathing Space dance-in-health programme continued to work with children living with life-limiting and life-changing conditions and their families. This year, participatory projects were delivered by Dance Art Foundation Associate Artists Susannah Tate (North and North East) and Louise Klarnett (London and South East).

Led by Susannah Tate, our Breathing Space Children's Programme projects at the children's hospices Butterwick House (Stockton-on-Tees), Derian House (Chorley) and Jigsaw (Carlisle) and at Cumberland Infirmary Special Baby Care Unit (Carlisle) were generously supported by BBC Children in Need. In September 2019, we completed the first of two years funding from Children in Need, bridging into the second year of our current grant award in autumn 2019. Louise Klarnett continued her pioneering work at The Magpie Project in Newham, East London. The Magpie Project ensures that children living in temporary accommodation are given every opportunity to thrive socially, emotionally, and developmentally, and that Mums are supported to parent their children positively under very stressful circumstances. Louise's work supports child development and improves children's developmental delays through creative dance, movement and touch, whilst nurturing and emotional wellbeing and bonding and meaningful embodied interactions between Mums and children in a safe and playful environment. Our community projects are very well received, which, in our view, attests to the significant contribution that creative movement and dance can bring to physical, emotional and psychological health and wellbeing.

Advocacy

This year Dance Art Foundation consolidated its work in artist advocacy with a new initiative, Artist-Curator-Leader, a systemic change project and roundtable series aimed at increasing artist leadership and artist representation in UK dance. The project aspires towards a vibrant and thriving UK dance sector with artists voices joining forces with those from venues, dance organisations, funding bodies and arts institutions to achieve strategic, representative and equitable sector development. It was initiated by Artistic Director Joe Moran in close collaboration with choreographers and academics Dr Nicola Conibere and Dr Efrosini Protopapa and project partners The Place (Amy Bell), South East Dance (Lou Rogers) and Yorkshire Dance (Tanya Steinhauser). The project was funded by Surf The Wave (Pavilion Dance South West) with additional support from South East Dance, Dance4 (Paul Russ and Hannah Sharpe), Chisenhale Dance Space (Es Morgan and Daniel Pitt) and Sadler's Wells (Robyn Cabaret). The Working Group are Amy Bell (The Place), Hannah Bruce (Arts Council England), Paul Burns (Creative Scotland), Nicola Conibere (Artist), Alexandrina Hemsley (Artist), Gillie Kleiman (Artist), Joe Moran (Artist), Freddie Opoku-Addaie (Artist), Efrosini Protopapa (Artist), Lou Rogers (South East Dance) and Paul Russ (Dance4).

Phase one activity completed in this financial year comprised artist-partner-funder Working Group meetings, public and invited roundtables, and wider research. Phase two of the project in 2020-21 will see the development of a Guidance Publication to be published online with best practice, recommendations and resources (funded by Arts Council England, Dance4 and Yorkshire Dance).

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Production and performance

In April 2019, Dance Art Foundation presented a three-week performance exhibition in the galleries at The Lowry in Salford, the fourth event in their EDITS series of residencies, installations and interruptions. The evolving exhibition drew upon Artistic Director Joe Moran's experience as a dancer, choreographer, curator and artist to transform the galleries into a performance-based exhibition and open studio: combining Moran's choreographic spray paint works, live performance, film installation and public research with a small team of dancers. The exhibition featured a number of live performances across the three weeks and welcomed a broad range of audiences including local community groups, and schools, college and youth groups.

We were delighted to continue our relationship with Norwich Castle Museum and Art Gallery with a series of performances in May 2019 as part of the Norfolk and Norwich Festival 2019. Norwich Castle Museum and Art Gallery was a partner on the 2018 fig-futures project for which Dance Art Foundation presented A Setup, a performance exhibition by Artistic Director Joe Moran and Irish sculptor Eva Rothschild at Kettle's Yard in Cambridge in September 2018. fig-futures involved the acquisition of art works by all participating artists and, through this initiative, Joe Moran's Singular became the very first performance work to enter the Castle's permanent contemporary art collections. The acquisition was funded by Outset Contemporary Art Fund, Art Fund and Arts Council England with Kettle's Yard working as Norwich Castle's collecting partner.

Over the Summer and Autumn 2019, Dance Art Foundation worked with Radar, the commissioning and research art programme at Loughborough University, on research exploring the meeting points between contemporary dance and professional wrestling. The project culminated in a film, exhibition at Attenborough Arts Centre in Leicester and publication in collaboration with Live Art Development Agency (LADA). Dance Art Foundation also presented performance works by Artistic Director Joe Moran - Thirst, Arrangement and Decommission - at Sadler's Wells in London, NottDance Festival at Nottingham Contemporary gallery in Nottingham and Duckie's Posh Club in London. Performances achieved full capacity audiences and welcomed new audiences to Dance Art Foundation's work.

At the end of 2019, Artistic Director Joe Moran was commissioned to create a new performance for Whitechapel Gallery, in dialogue with visual artist Carlos Bunga's exhibition Something Necessary and Useful, produced by Dance Art Foundation. Conceived as a site-specific work, Materiality Will Be Rethought was developed as a live performance within the sculptural environment but postponed and then cancelled due to Covid-19 restrictions, shortly before its premiere in March 2020. With support from Arts Council England and private patrons, the three-part commission was adapted and reimagined as a film work to be presented online later in 2020.

Commercial projects and earned income

Under the project title Dance Art Limited, Dance Art Foundation has tested working with a more commercial focus so it may increase earned income to help fund its core expenditure and charitable objectives. Activities in this area this year has included choreography of the Royal College of Art (RCA) MA Fashion show.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Finance

Dance Art Foundation's work this year focused on production, participation and advocacy. The charity has maintained a solid, mixed financial economy attracting a broader range of commissioning support in this financial year and increases in individual giving and earned income. Income was received from charitable grants and public funding (28%), commissioning and presentation fees (52%), private donations (11%) and earned, projects and other income (10%). Its annual turnover was £42,000. Activities included programmes that crossed over from last year that were completed in this financial year, as well as new projects and those that bridge into 2020-21.

Reserves policy

Dance Art Foundation is not in receipt of core funding. It receives restricted, project-based or unrestricted income from grants, commissions, workshops, performances and donations that is spent in accordance with its charitable objectives. The charity retains reserves required to complete committed projects.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Funds in deficit

The Trustees and Artistic Director are pleased to report that the charity is in a confident financial position. Overheads have been considerably reduced to monthly insurance payments and subscriptions (£60) and annual accountancy fees (£900). These costs are incorporated into project grants and also funded by gift aid income from individual donations. Our current financial model means that whilst we rely upon project income to deliver our work, as an organisation, we are resilient due to current very low overheads.

At the year end, the accounts show small project budget deficits in the following areas, however these represent confirmed outstanding income that will balance each budget in the coming financial year (£86.18 The Lowry; £450 HE lectures; £1,062.50 Arrangement/ Decommission).

The Trustees express their sincere thanks to Dance Art Foundation's artists, project staff and production teams, its funders, supporters and project partners, and the participants and audiences who have engaged with its work. All these valuable groups have made our work possible this year.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The Board of Trustees is ethically and financially responsible for the charity. The position of Trustee is voluntary, and one for which none of the Trustees or those closely related to them may receive financial remuneration. Trustees are recruited and appointed on the basis of necessary skills sets at board level and their under-representation. Candidates are sought through pertinent networks decided up on the Trustees. Appointments are made by proposal to the board which are considered and voted upon by all board members.

The one third of the trustees are required to retire each year and maybe re-elected by the board.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
