# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

Dance Art Foundation is an independent national charity inspiring recognition of the cultural significance of dance, and advancing public and individual engagement, understanding and appreciation of dance as a contemporary art form.

The objectives of Dance Art Foundation are:

a. to advance education for the public benefit by the promotion of the arts, in particular, but not exclusively the art of dance.

b. to relieve individuals who are suffering from physical or psychological illness or disability by the provision of facilities for them to participate in dance and the arts for therapeutic purposes.

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Overview

Dance Art Foundation incubates new ideas in dance that it takes out into the world in fresh and imaginative ways with a strongly committed focus on public benefit. Its performance work is bold and progressive, often transgressing art form boundaries and in dialogue with other disciplines. Its Critical Dialogues projects drives dance forward, fostering fertile debate that challenges artists and widens public access to new thinking in dance. In social engagement, Dance Art Foundation is an international leader in dance-in-health. Choreographer Joe Moran directs the charity, and curates and produces its programmes and activities. He works in collaboration with a network of freelance project and production artists and staff.

# **Participation**

Dance Art Foundation continued its work with children living with life-limiting and life-changing conditions and their families through its nationally recognised Breathing Space dance-in-health programme. Its work in this area is consistently well received and attests to the significant contribution that creative movement and dance can bring to physical, emotional and psychological health and wellbeing. This year, participation projects were delivered by two Dance Art Foundation Associate Artists: Susannah Tate (North and North East) and Louise Klarnett (London). Breathing Space Children's Programme projects supported by Dischma Foundation and D'Oyly Carte Charitable Trust were completed in this financial year, and new programmes began with the support of BBC Children in Need and in partnership with The Magpie Project in Newham, East London.

#### Production and performance

In 2018-19, Dance Art Foundation focused on the research and development of a new production by Artistic Director Joe Moran through three residencies in the UK and France: Wysing Arts Centre in Cambridge, Launch Pad LaB in France and The Lowry in Salford. Each residency incorporated public performance events of work-in-progress performance, audience feedback and discussion.

In Sept 2018, Dance Art Foundation co-presented a week-long performance-based exhibition at Kettle's Yard in Cambridge as part of the fig-futures programme. A Setup was a collaboration between Artistic Director Joe Moran and Irish sculptor Eva Rothschild. The artists' collaboration saw Moran's durational performance work Singular performed for the entire duration of the exhibition within and in proximity to Rothschild's sculptures. In a separate gallery, each artist presented a recent film work.

In Oct 2018, Dance Art Foundation as invited by Bluecoat centre for contemporary arts in Liverpool to present a collection of performance works by Joe Moran. The duets Singular and Thirst were presented across the gallery and its garden, courtyards and public space throughout the course of day with an evening performance of Moran's On The Habit of Being Oneself in the gallery performance space. The evening opened with a short participatory physical warm up for the entire audience.

In Feb 2019, Artistic Director Joe Moran was invited to restage his all-male work Arrangement for six women at London Contemporary Dance School. The new adaptation called Rearrangement was performed in The Place theatre over two evenings. Also, in Feb 2019, Moran presented Singular at Sadler's Wells for its annual Sampled Festival. The work was performed by two couples in relation to large scale choreographic drawings by Moran created in spray paint on painted wood panels and installed in the theatre's Rosebery Room.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

#### Financial position

Dance Art Foundation focused its work on three key areas this year: research and develop towards new productions, touring existing performance works upon invitation, and participatory workshops in hospices and community settings. This saw income for the charity's work focused in two main areas: residency, research and presentation fees (72.4%) and project grants (27.4), with the remainder of income from small donations (0.2%). The turnover for this year of participation and research was a modest £36,000. Once again, activity included programmes that crossed over from last year that were completed in this financial year, as well as new projects and those that bridge into 2019-20.

#### **Dance Art Limited**

Dance Art Foundation has tested out more commercially focused activity to increase earned income in order to fund and further its charitable objectives and core expenditure. This work has included Artistic Director Joe Moran's choreography of shows and events in fashion. This activity includes Moran's work with the Royal College of Art on its annual MA Fashion show, this year presented at The Store X, 180 The Strand in Central London.

#### Reserves policy

Dance Art Foundation is not in receipt of core funding. It receives restricted, project-based or unrestricted income from grants, commissions, workshops, performances and donations that is spent in accordance with its charitable objectives. The charity retains reserves required to complete committed projects.

#### **Funds in deficit**

The Trustees and Artistic Director have conscientiously addressed the charity's previous deficit in unrestricted funds, which arose due to necessary core expenditure not covered by project budgets. The deficit has been cleared over the past year and funds have been secured that bring the core budget to a £1000 surplus. At the year end, accounts show a remaining small deficit of £762 in the management and administration budget line. This is off set in the Trustees' planning by confirmed partnership income of £1,800 that will be received early in the coming financial year. The Trustees have also initiated a funding strategy for core expenditure not covered by project grants to avert any future deficits.

The Trustees close the year expressing their sincere thanks to Dance Art Foundation's funders and supporters, project partners, participants and audiences, and project staff, artists and production teams who have made our work possible this year.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

# **Governing document**

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

#### Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The Board of Trustees is ethically and financially responsible for the charity. The position of Trustee is voluntary, and one for which none of the Trustees or those closely related to them may receive financial remuneration. Trustees are recruited and appointed on the basis of necessary skills sets at board level and their under-representation. Candidates are sought through pertinent networks decided up on the Trustees. Appointments are made by proposal to the board which are considered and voted upon by all board members.

The one third of the trustees are required to retire each year and maybe re-elected by the board.

#### Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

#### Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Dance Art Foundation ('the Company')

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
