TRUSTEES' REPORT

The Trustees present their report and the financial statements for the period ended 30 June 2001.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Law applicable to charitable companies in England and Wales requires the Trustees, who are also directors of the company, to prepare financial statements for each year which give a true and fair view of the state of the charitable company's financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year.

In preparing financial statements giving a true and fair view, the Trustees should follow best practice and:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to assume that the charitable company will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the relevant legislation. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

CONSTITUTION

The company was incorporated on 11 February 2000 and is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Company is limited by guarantee and has no share capital. The company is a registered charity and is affiliated to Emmaus UK.

OBJECTIVES

The principal objective of the company is to provide accommodation and employment for people in accordance with the principles of the Emmaus movement.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENT, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

The main focus of activity since incorporation has been on acquiring a suitable site on which to set up an Emmaus Community. The Company has been fortunate to have been granted a 50 year lease on an excellent 15 acre site at a peppercorn rent by the Trustees of the Carlton Education Trust. The lease is expected to be signed imminently. Conversion work will be extensive, providing accommodation eventually for up to 30 Companions with workshops, an I.T. suite, retail areas and staff accommodation all on one site. Necessary Planning consents have been obtained for the change of use. Outline plans have been prepared and quantity surveyors have prepared budget estimates.

A significant amount of time has been spent by staff, Trustees and volunteers in putting together a business plan and fundraising strategy in order that the project can come to fruition. Since the year end we have received significant further grants and donations towards our work, bringing our funds (restricted and unrestricted) to approximately £240,000 (Sept. 2001). Clearly, much more money will be needed in order for the development to be completed.

We are currently in the process of recruiting a Community Leader and filling other positions necessary to the running of the community and co-ordinating the many volunteers. It is hoped to open the Community to a small number of Companions (residents) by the end of 2001 and to build up the community numbers as funding and progress on building work permit.

RELATIONSHIP WITH TURVEY MONASTERY

The momentum to form a new Emmaus community at Turvey (Carlton) came from individuals linked to the Monastery of Christ Our Saviour, Turvey. The Company was incorporated and registered as a charity using the monastery address pending acquisition of a dedicated site from which to operate the community. The Monastery and friends of the monastery raised seed-corn monies to donate to the project, amounting to £84,000 prior to the company's registration as a separate charity. The monastery continues to support the project in the form of publicity, finding volunteers and making contact with other groups and Churches to help with fundraising. It has also assisted the project by payment for consultancy services (see Note 8 in Financial Statements).

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the period ended 30 June 2001

1. Accounting Policies

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost basis and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (Accounting and Reporting by Charities 2000), and applicable accounting standards. The accounts are prepared on an accruals basis. The expenditure headings within the Income and Expenditure Account have been chosen in accordance with the guidelines set out in the Charities SORP 2000 regarding Charities with a gross income of less than £250,000 (para. 348).

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds comprise accumulated surpluses and deficits on general funds. They are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees of Emmaus Turvey in furtherance of the general charitable objectives. Restricted funds are amounts for specific purposes as defined by the donor.

Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are recognised at the point of receipt of monies.

Resources Expended

Those costs which are attributable to different functions of the charity are allocated as such. Where costs relate to more than one function of the charity, the Trustees do not consider it appropriate to allocate individual costs at the point where the cost is incurred. Alternatively the Trustees apportion aggregated costs in proportions which they consider to be a fair estimate of their functional split.

2. Money raised/donated by Turvey Monastery.

Fundraising for the Emmaus project was done by the Monastery prior to Emmaus Turvey's incorporation and its registration as a Charity.

3. Intangible Income (Loaned asset)

The charity has been given the use of a van by one of its Trustees, George Hartigan. The cash equivalent value of this loan is estimated to be in the region of £600 per annum. This item is matched by an equivalent sum ("Van running costs") in the Statements under Resources Expended. (Policy in accordance with Para. 99, Charity SORP 2000)

4. Salary Costs
