Footprints Womens Centre was established in May 1991 in Poleglass and has developed to meet the distinct needs of the women from the Colin area. Their work has culminated in the provision of a purpose built facility in the area which was completed in February 2001.

It was started by local women some of which are still on the board of directors. Membership is for women only and services are provided for women and children from the Colin Neighbourhood

It exists to help women grow in confidence to become more aware of their own potential and to help create a positive role model for children. The purpose of the charity is to provide quality childcare, support, education and training for women from local communities. and to support social enterprise activities through the establishment and development of a trading arm which is owned by the women's centre. The charity is based on a community development ethos. It is run by women in a friendly and non threatening environment creating a space where a women's voice can be heard

Footpunts Womens Centre has been established for 19 years and has developed a wide range of services and activities for women and their families including

Adult learning providing progression routes for women returners within a training and education programme developed in line with the National curriculum

Financial review

The results for the period are as set out on pages 7 to 22. The charity returned net incoming resources of £25 248. (2009. £2 597) of which there were unrestricted/designated net incoming resources of £9 079 and restricted net incoming resources of £16 169.

At 31 March 2010, the level of unrestricted funds held was £40 954

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six months charitable activity expenditure. The directors considers that reserves at this level will ensure that in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year.

It is the strategic objective of the organisation to establish reserves which would allow it to operate for twelve months without other sources of income

The Directors have set aside out of unrestricted funds the following designated funds

A redundancy reserve of £7 000 Women's support fund of £43 741 finance and business reserve of £18 000 governance costs for solicitors fees of £2 000 training and education programmes of £26 253 senior citizens fund of £3 000 and miscellaneous overheads of £7 000

Restricted funds are restricted for the purpose specified in letters of offers provided by the funding bodies At 31 March 2010 the balance of restricted funds was £670 054

1 Accounting policies

11 Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small charity

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice. Accounting and Reporting by Charities, issued in March 2005 and the Companies Act 2006.

The group financial statements consolidate the accounts of Footprints Womens Centre and its subsidiary. Footprints Trading Ltd for the financial year

The company is recognised as a charity within the meaning of Section 506(1) Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988 and is therefore entitled to the exemptions outlined under Section 505 of the Act

12 Incoming resources

Donations are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable

Grants that relate to specific capital expenditure are treated as restricted income which is credited to the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. Revenue grants are credited to the Statement of Financial Activities in accordance with the terms of the grant.

Income is deferred when it does not meet the criteria for recognition as incoming resources in the Statement of Financial Activities as entitlement to the incoming resource does not exist at the balance sheet date

Bank interest is accounted for on a basis of the amounts receivable

13 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred

Chantable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the chanty and include the audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the chanty

14 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows.

17 Accumulated funds

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the accounts

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds which have been set aside at the discretion of the directors for specific purposes. The purposes and uses of the designated funds are set out in the notes to the accounts.

Unrestricted/general funds are funds which are expendable at the discretion of the charity in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity. In addition funds may be held in order to finance capital investment and working capital.

2 Activities for generating funds

Activities for generating funds includes income of £2 062 from the management of St Luke's Parents Centre and also income from the provision of childcare and catering services provided through Footprints Trading Ltd. Resources expended in generating funds includes childcare and catering costs expended by Footprints Trading Ltd.
