Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2020. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The objective of the Charity is to support families who may be in any way affected by a family member's drug and/or alcohol abuse.

Significant activities

We aim to make a positive difference in the lives of people looking for support through various routes such as family support, referral to support groups and being there to provide advice, guidance and assistance where appropriate. Our recently opened Spa also allows for people to access holistic therapies as well as hypnotherapies.

We also encourage the development of individual Family Support and Kinship Groups. These services are delivered by a committed and caring team of Management, staff and volunteers who promote and protect the welfare of vulnerable people and their families.

We ensure that our services are economic, efficient and effective whilst being open and responsive to the needs of the people using our service.

We also ensure that our services and organisation do not discriminate against people on the grounds of age, race, gender, disability, religion or sexuality.

The Charity's principal activity during the year continued to be the provision of care and support for the family and friends of drug and alcohol abusers.

Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities Volunteers

FASS continues to rely on the support of its volunteers and we currently have 20 Volunteers (5 being board members). One of our volunteers is nearing the end of their COSCA course and hopes to be more involved with FASS. Our volunteers have attended various training events.

Events

FASS Remembrance Service

We continue to hold this annual service and the 26th Service took place last year on Thursday 21st November 2019 over 200 people attended the service and every year there is always positive reviews. The service remembers those who have died through alcohol/drug related problems. The family reflection was delivered by a lady who had lost her sister. The service was opened by Baillie Scanlon, carried out by Canon Tom White and Rev Peter Davidge with music from the Motherwell Choir and refreshments afterwards at The lodging house mission.

Balloch Day Trip

FASS annual day trip took place on Saturday 17th August 2019, Group members and staff went along to Balloch for the day and enjoyed an hours Cruise around Loch Lomond, an mini train ride around Lomond Shores, afternoon tea, stroll around the shops and then a 2 course meal before heading home. 100% of the evaluations received said they had a great day.

Our Volunteer Coordinator also did the same trip with some of our volunteers in July 2019 and they also enjoyed themselves.

Schoenstatt Day Trip

The annual retreat to Schoenstatt took place on Wednesday 5th June 2019, with approximately 18 members and 3 staff members. This is a well-known beloved trip to group members. Those who go along always give FASS fantastic feedback.

FASS Open Day

FASS held an Open Day in July 2019 to recruit more volunteers. This event went well and we were able to obtain more names. One of our current volunteers spoke of their experience of being a volunteer with FASS and one of our therapists came in to show everyone the FASS Spa.

The Spa continues to offer a wide range of Complimentary treatments, Hypnotherapy and Haircuts. The Spa has however been temporarily closed since March 2020 due to COVID-19.

FASS Quiz Night

FASS had a quiz night in September 2019 at GoGlasgow Urban Hotel. This was a quiz and disco with a finger buffet and complimentary drink on arrival. Everyone who attended said they enjoyed the evening.

Bereavement resource Pack Training

We continued with our Bereavement training sessions. We were contacted by a Group of GPs who came to us over 2 visits to not only attend the training but to have a comprehensive overview of FASS and what we do. All of their feedback was highly positive. We were also asked by one of our Bereavement Groups to complete the training and this was adapted to accommodate their perspective, being the bereaved family. The whole group were impressed by the pack and the training received.

Training

COSCA Counselling Skills: Katie Troy successfully completed this course in 2019. Mandy Macfarlane completed 3 training sessions 2019-2020, Michele Kearney completed 3 training sessions 2019-2020, Kathleen Kennedy completed 10 training sessions 2019-2020, Val Connell completed 2 training sessions 2018-2019 and Janine Aitken completed 1 training session 2019-2020. Our Volunteers have also attended 5 training sessions 2019-2020 and one volunteer is just about to finish his COSCA training.

Christmas Night

FASS held their Annual Christmas night at GoGlasgow Urban Hotel on Friday 6th December 2019 Members sat down to a 2 course meal and enjoyed a short quiz, DJ and raised £250 from its raffle.

Charitable activities Support Therapies

FASS Spa continues to offer Hypnotherapy, Therapeutic and Holistic sessions on Tuesdays and Thursdays as well as Haircuts on Fridays, all performed by our qualified volunteers

StreetSoccer

A variety of clothing and toys were provided and split between our members

Caley Office

Our print suppliers donated kids gifts (all new). They bought for a specific gender and age and passed them to FASS to distribute to the kinship children who would not be getting a lot of gifts this year. We were able to help approximately 15 families with these gifts.

Cash for Kids

We applied for Cash for Kids for 164 kids within our Kinship Groups and this was distributed in December 2019.

Groups

The groups continue to meet in FASS as well as in the community. We held 5 monthly Members meetings and had planned a Health and Wellbeing session during the March meeting however this had to be cancelled due to COVID 19. We intend to reschedule this as soon as we are able to. Lorraine McGoldrick went to visit 5 Groups during this time, as well as attending a DVD Launch arranged by one of the Kinship Groups.

NA Groups

3 NA groups continue to meet in FASS on a weekly basis, however as of March we cancelled these due to COVID

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

It is the intention of the trustees to maintain free reserves which are sufficient to cover at least three months' ordinary running costs, the cost of cessation of contracts, redundancy for staff and other costs which would arise in the event of closure. The trustees estimate that these total costs, at the end of the reporting period, amount to £73,150.

FASS currently holds £100,606 in unrestricted reserves so the trustees are satisfied that this aim is being met. It should be stressed that the trustees do not anticipate or intend closure of the organisation at any point in the foreseeable future.

The balance of the reserves are held for future investment in services, equipment and in the event of relocation.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Results

The Charity incurred a net deficit of -£7,098 for the year ended 31 March 2020 (2019:deficit -£2,688).

At balance date, reserves stood at £139,209 (2019: £146,307) with £100,606 of these being Unrestricted (2019: £111,501).

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by articles of associations and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Organisational structure

The Charity is governed by a board of Directors/Trustees. The day to day running of the Charity is managed by Mrs Lorraine McGoldrick (Service Manager).

Key management remuneration

In the opinion of the trustees there is one member of key management personnel; the Service Manager.

The total cost to the employer paid for this post including national insurance and employer pension contributions in 2019/20 was £38,191.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

FUNDS DISTRIBUTED ON BEHALF OF OTHERS

During the year the charity supported individuals and families who sought small donations from Cash4kids. They also assisted some Groups with various funding applications. This funding was either applied for by FASS or an affiliated group and received into FASS bank account for distribution

During the year a total of £13,350 was received and distributed to these Groups and Kinship families.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Family Addiction Support Service

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2020 set out on pages seven to sixteen.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2020

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings - 10% straight line Fixtures, fittings and equipment - 10% straight line

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Caravan - Various small grants and donations for the purchase of a caravan or similar accommodation

The National Lottery Community Fund- Provide funding to pay for our Volunteer Coordinator post.
