Report of the Trustees 1st December 2001 to 30th November 2002

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 30 November 2002. The financial statements comply with current statutory requirements, the memorandum and articles of association and the Statement of Recommended Practice – Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Objects of the charity

The objects of the Association are to provide assistance through mediation for adults and children who are affected by the breaking down of family relationships, and so:

- Prevent poverty, hardship and distress caused by the breakdown of relationships;
- Safeguard and protect good health, both mental and physical;
- Preserve and maintain family relationships.

Organisation

A Board of Trustees meeting quarterly administers the charity. There are sub-committees covering training, mediator accreditation, and complaints, plus other sub-committees formed on an ad hoc basis, for example, for conferences, and co-opted members join the Board from time to time for specific purposes.

The Association operates without a Chief Executive, but administrative support is provided by IDR Europe Limited (trading as ADR Group)

Related parties

The Association is now in a contractual relationship with IDR Europe Limited, who provide secretarial and administrative support, manage the membership database and subscriptions, run the foundation and advanced training programme as approved by the Association, and support the network of Professional Practice Consultants.

Overview of activities

At the end of 2001 the Professional Practice Co-ordinator had been forced to retire through ill-health, after many years with the Association. A new appointment was made in January 2002, and the Professional Practice Consultant network was able to continue to meet regularly and to ensure consultants maintained their required CPD points.

In May 2002 a very successful reception at 10 Downing Street, hosted by Cherie Booth QC, one of the Vice Presidents of the Association, was held, with forty guests including High Court Judges, academics, mediators, other mediation organisations, and other supporters of the work of the Association. Cherie Booth made a speech supporting mediation as valuable alternative to the more traditional legal processes, and praising the work of the Association.

The new web site was launched in March 2002, and a number of foundation and advanced training courses were run jointly by FMA and ADR Group.

The AGM was held at the Royal Courts of Justice in September, and was very well attended by some sixty members.

Financial activities and reserves

There have been no changes in the accounting policies during the year.

During the year the company made a surplus of £7,666. At the balance sheet date the company had net assets of £8,680.

The unrestricted fund represents the accumulated surpluses from previous years. It also represents the unrestricted reserves of the company.

Risk management

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the company is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the company, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to such risks.

Trustees' responsibilities in relation to financial matters

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements and give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the financial year, and of its surplus or deficit for the financial year. in doing so the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and:
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP 2000) issued in October 2000, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 1985.

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis. Having reviewed the charity's current and future sources of funding, borrowing facilities and support for the following 12 months, the trustees have no reason to believe that the charity will not be able to continue as a going concern for the foreseeable future.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds comprise accumulated surpluses and deficits on general funds. They are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general charitable objectives.

Incoming resources

Charitable trading activities

Income from courses is included in incoming resources in the period in which the course takes place. Income from membership fees is including in incoming resources over the period to which the fee relates.

Grants

Income from grants is included in incoming resources when the grant is receivable.

Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT which cannot be recovered.

Direct charitable expenditure comprises expensiture, including staff costs, directly attributable to the charitable activities.

Management and administration costs comprise those costs that cannot be directly attributed to charitable activities. These costs are incurred in connection with the management of the charity, its organisational administration, and ensuring compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.
