THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31st MARCH 2009

The directors have pleasure in presenting their report and the unaudited financial statements of the company for the year ended 31st March 2009.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the company during the year was that of film and media education and training within the community. The company is a not-for-profit organisation.

7 film commissions and regular projects throughout the year in schools have been the main work at Haltwhistle Film Project over this year.

Nearly 400 people have been directly involved in hands-on film skills training through HFP.

We would like to thank volunteers who have worked with us; their in-kind contribution is estimated to be worth in the region of £10000. Highlights include:

Projects with young people:

Creative Partnerships

5 projects were completed:

Corbridge First School - 2 films: Animation and a documentary about the history of film

Wylam First School - 6 films based on looking at the 5 curriculum strands through dance. Premiere held in 5 locations at Dance City, Newcastle.

Benton Park Primary School - Maths and Media Project

Jarrow Cross Primary School Animation Project

Hallbankgate First School - Mantle of the Expert film project began with whole school.

Other work with young people

Gosforth Park First School, Creative Maths Project. National Centre for Excellence in Maths funded.

Swarland Fist School - animation project.

South Tynedale Middle School - weekly sessions in filmmaking.

Scotswood Community Garden - premiere of the The Nature Club in converted shed at their Spring Fair, short film made by children.

St. Paul's Primary Newcastle - creative maths animation project.

Haydon Bridge Youth Group - short film made at animation workshops, young people with learning disabilities.

Weekly Open Nights continue to be run at HFP on a voluntary basis.

Screened the first D'Oscars Film Festival at Dilston Mencap College.

5 young people from schools in Haydon Bridge, Prudhoe, Newcastle and Leicester did their work experience with us this year.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

Income

The income shown in the surplus and deficit account represents amounts invoiced during the year.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Equipment

20% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against surplus on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

Financial instruments

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.
