#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

For the year ended 31 December 2012

#### ACCOUNTING POLICIES

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#### BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable UK accounting standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice)

The company is exempt by virtue of Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group financial statements. These financial statements present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Under Financial Reporting Standard (FRS) 1 the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the company in its own published consolidated financial statements

As 100% of the company's voting rights are controlled within the group headed by G4S plc, the company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with entities which are wholly owned members of the group. The consolidated financial statements of G4S plc, within which this company is included, can be obtained from the address given in note 10.

#### **TAXATION**

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid or recovered using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all material timing differences that have originated, but not reversed, by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis using tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences reverse based on tax rates and laws substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

#### FOREIGN CURRENCIES

Transactions in forcign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange in operation at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

#### GOING CONCERN

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis, notwithstanding the company's net current habilities, which the directors believe to be appropriate for the following reasons. The company is dependent for its working capital on funds provided to it by G4S plc, the company's ultimate parent undertaking. G4S plc has provided the company with an undertaking that for at least 12 months from the date of approval of these financial statements, it will continue to make available such funds as are needed by the company and in particular will not seek repayment of the amounts currently made available.

This should enable the company to continue in operational existence for the foresceable future by meeting its liabilities as they fall due for payment. As with any company placing reliance on its parent undertaking for financial support, the directors acknowledge that there can be no certainty that this support will continue although, at the date of approval of these financial statements, they have no reason to believe that it will not do so

Based on this undertaking the directors believe that it remains appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis
