# Objects, Organisation and Activities

The work of supporting home educators, responding to media enquiries and generally raising the profile of home education, continues

The directors opposed proposals from some quarters for greater control over home educators. The current legislation, in their opinion, is sufficient to protect the freedom of parents to choose home education, and the safety of children. The activities of the directors in connection with this issue, as well as other government initiatives, are reported in the HEAS Bulletin as the directors are aware that their subscribers take a close interest in such matters, and wish to be kept informed of what is being done on their behalf

The directors regret that the long awaited DfES Guidance on Home Education for LEAs has still not yet been completed. This is a matter of concern to them, the existence of such guidelines would be a big step forward in ensuring a consistency of approach throughout England, as well as promoting good relationships between LEAs and home educators. The directors note that the Scottish guidelines, created for the purpose of conformity and good relationships, were distributed two years ago, and are currently being reviewed.

The directors have been active in responding to government consultation exercises, and take every opportunity to protect the interests of home educators in doing so

The directors have taken account of changes in legislation regarding truancy patrols and have advised their subscribers accordingly. Efforts to engage the DfES and The Home. Office to co-operate in the production of a truancy card that will protect the identity of home educators while affirming the validity of home education, are on-going.

The directors seek every opportunity to find ways that enable external candidates to sit examinations, and again, these are reported to subscribers via the bulletin

The directors were able to appoint a media contact during the year. The appointment has proved beneficial in promoting the work of the company and making home education known to families.

The subscribers' area of the website has been replaced by a bulletin board. This gives the same information as the previous subscribers' area, with the addition of a facility that enables subscribers to communicate with each other on a range of issues such selling and buying items of educational relevance.

Meetings with subscribers continue, enabling the directors to form a clear idea of the kind of service that they should be offering. They have been pleased to note that most of the requirements of subscribers are already being met

The sale of publications and a charge to those who wish to subscribe have been sufficient to generate enough income to meet all expenditure incurred in achieving the objects of the company. The subscription rate of £13 50 remains the same as the previous year

The company is run by the directors who live throughout the UK Day to day communication is by fax, email and telephone The directors meet informally from time to time A meeting of directors took place at the Annual General Meeting, and it is anticipated that this practice will continue

## Review of progress and achievements

The directors consider that the company has maintained a good service to home educators

The resource library continues to expand and remains well used by subscribers Other aids to learning have been obtained during the year, to the benefit of subscribers

The bulletin, issued four times a year, continues to be well received and recipients often express appreciation of it

The directors keep the management of the company under constant review
