ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write each asset down to its estimated residual value evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Plant and machinery

33 1/3 % straight line

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

20% reducing balance

Motor vehicles

25% reducing balance

DEFERRED TAXATION

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. Timing differences are differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis.

LEASED ASSETS

The annual rentals on 'operating leases' are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term.

PENSIONS CONTRIBUTIONS

Pension contributions are charged to the profit and loss accounts as incurred. These contributions are invested seperately from the company's assets.

FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSLATION

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the accounting date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. All differences are taken to profit and loss account.

TURNOVER

Turnover represents the invoiced value, net of Value Added Tax, of services provided to customers.

GROUP RELIEF

During the year, the group revised its policy regarding the recognition of group relief. Previously no payment has been made to recognise the effect of group relief in either the recipient or donor. This has lead to a prior year adjustment of £78,000 (2002 £51,000) to the corporation tax charge and intercompany creditors.
