Notes to the Accounts

1 Purchase of Equipment

Groam House Museum has continued the practice of writing off the full costs of equipment in the year of purchase. This corresponds both with public sector funding practice and with the realities of a small charity, where a future income stream, against which costs can be carried forward, is never assured.

2 Members' Funds

As a Company limited by guarantee, Groam House Museum has no share capital, nor are its members required to contribute, except to the extent guaranteed (£1 per member) in the event of an insolvent winding up

3 Bain 2007 Exhibition

This project was a great success, raising awareness of George Bain's considerable achievements over his lifetime and their ongoing impact on Highland life & culture. This has been a unique opportunity for Groam House Museum to stage a major external exhibition programme, increasing awareness of the museum's internationally important Bain collection, leading, in a couple of instances, to donations of Bain material. Planning and preparation for this project has increased our knowledge base. In addition, the capital expenditure programme has provided the means for staging future exhibitions. The value of the museum quality cases, frames, mounts & banners so gained, more than offsets the overall depletion of museum financial reserves.
