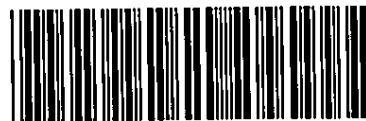

BASIS OF OPINION





1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007).

Related parties transactions

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Hallmark Healthcare Group Limited. The company's ultimate parent undertaking is Hallmark Healthcare Group Holdings Limited, the consolidated accounts of which are publicly available. Accordingly, the company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 8 from disclosing transactions with members or shareholders of the Hallmark Healthcare Group Holdings Limited group of companies.

Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts invoiced for services provided during the year.

Goodwill

Positive purchased goodwill arising on acquisitions is capitalised, classified as an asset on the Balance Sheet and amortised over its estimated useful life up to a maximum of 20 years. This length of time is presumed to be the maximum useful life of purchased goodwill because it is difficult to make projections beyond this period. Goodwill is reviewed for impairment at the end of the first full financial year following each acquisition and subsequently as and when necessary if circumstances emerge that indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Amortisation

Amortisation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Goodwill - 5% per annum on cost

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Freehold Buildings	- 2% per annum on cost
Plant & Machinery	- 12.5% per annum on cost
Fixtures & Fittings	- 20% per annum on cost
Equipment	- 20% per annum on cost

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

The useful economic life of fixtures, fittings and equipment has been reviewed and revised. The directors consider that the economic life of these categories is different to that previously determined. As a consequence, with effect from 1 April 2008, the rate of depreciation has been changed from 25% per annum reducing balance to 20% per annum straight line, applied to the net book value at 1 April 2008 and to the cost of any additions thereafter. The effect of this revised depreciation method has been to reduce the depreciation charge in the current year by £6,032.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exception:

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.
